FEBRUARY, 2015 PRESIDENT'S REPORT ~ CORA DUNCAN-FOSTER

1. The Detroit Partnership Day 2015 will be held on Saturday, March 28th. I applied for this activity to be held in Grandmont. I am excited to announce that the Grandmont Community Association was selected. We should receive 30 volunteers to clean, removed debris, rake and cut along the fence line in Ramsay Park. The second site is to clean, rake and remove debris off of the Southfield Service Drive from Grand River to Schoolcraft. The volunteers should receive a lunch and water. I will be attending intake meetings that will offer great opportunity for the DP Day Committee to learn from us and work together to ensure a well-organized, smooth DP Day. An email was sent to Rod Brundidge, Director of DPW, for the rubbish bag pick up from Ramsay Park and Southfield Service Drive. Email was also sent to Marcus Davenport, Principal of Edison School, requesting volunteers, restroom service and room for student volunteers to eat their lunch. **Since this is our community, I hope we can get at least 30 Grandmont resident volunteers to assist! 2. A "THANK YOU" email was sent to Rod Brundidge for having the leaf bags removed from our Community before the snow hit.
3. **CHRIST THE KING CHURCH** is our site for our Saturday, April 11, 2015 Annual Meeting. It is handicap-accessible and has a large dining room with kitchen supplies. Furthermore, the hall is free to community associations.
4. The Grandmont Rosedale Neighborhood Safety meeting was held on Thursday, January 22nd. The speaker was Karen J. Moore, GRDC's Community Security Program Manager. She discussed how to report a suspicious person by looking at as many of characteristics when reporting a crime or suspicious behavior. Look at the hair (length, color, type: braids, close cut, etc.); clothing (color, type: jeans, jogging suit, logo: Nike, Pelle, etc.); and shoes (color, style, type: gym shoe, loafer, etc.). Body description demographics are: sex, age, height, weight and race. Facial description includes: hat, eye color, facial hair, wrinkles, glasses, nose shape, and complexion. When you report a suspicious vehicle observe what direction car was heading, number of passengers, license plate number, color, detailing, License Plate number and note whether the lights are working.
5. Carl Zerweck, Director of "**RIPPLING HOPE**" and his staff should be arriving this month to meet and give out the Home Repair Program Applications. Make sure you have paid your **\$25.00** dues so you can receive free home repair! Contact me by phoning **(313) 273-7914**. **GRANDMONT WAS ONLY GIVEN 60 APPLICATIONS SO HURRY UP AND APPLY!**
6. The Detroit City Council District One Monthly Meeting chaired by Councilman James Tate was held on Saturday, January 24th at Cornerstone Health + Technology High School.
 - a. The City Council is working on an Animal Husbandry Ordinance. Residents will be allowed to keep live stock which includes: chickens, rabbits, bees and goats. This will be only allowed in high vacancy areas of Detroit like Brightmoor. The ordinance will not be on the ballot.
 - b. The Detroit Land Bank has received 31, 000 properties. Sales of side lots have been enormous.
 - c. Azerine Jones, owner of **REEN'S CAKES N THINGS**, has retired and plans to sell her business.
 - d. Eleven year old Asia Newson, CEO Youth Entrepreneur, gave her **SUPER BUSINESS GIRL** presentation. She was featured on Ellen's TV Show. Asia teaches At-Risk-Youth how to make their own money and become entrepreneurs. She uses candles. This exceptional young lady lives in our community. Her website: www.superbusinessgirl.com
 - e. The Detroit Land Bank purchased 77 properties from Detroit Public Schools. DPS was unable to maintain properties. This was an exchange of properties for DPS to get out of debt. Fourteen of the properties will be demolished. Those not demolished will be boarded up.



ENVIRONMENTAL CORNER

Winter is in full force, nothing new for the seasoned Michigander. Keep your walk ways clean for easy access and safe pathway for the US Postal/Mail carriers, neighbors and other delivery services. Maintaining a snow and slush free driveway entrance at the street helps eliminate getting stuck, stalled and spinning tires to nowhere. With night temps dropping, this slush can freeze and cause more headaches. Let's lend a helping hand to our neighbors with disabilities, health challenges and elderly when needed after a large dumping of the white stuff.



DTE ENERGY work crews completed the installation of new *Smart Meters* in our community recently. If you are not satisfied with the condition of your lawn, landscaping and concrete after all the digging and installation work, contact **DTE** and communicate your concern. **DTE** will return in the Spring and rectify your grievance, repairing the lawn to its former status. **DTE** has assured the **GCA** they will fully repair and replace any property that has been impacted. Some neighbors have voiced concerns about the technology used to operate the *Smart Meter Equipment* recently installed to measure your homes' energy usage. If you have concerns about the health and personal safety effects of the microwave or radiation emissions from this technology, there are educational resources at your disposal. Go to: **Smart Meter Education Network** on the internet. A menu will appear with several websites that will empower you on the technology. These websites document pros and cons, experiences in other states/international, focus groups that question the benefits for homeowners/community, health concerns and environmental impact. If you wish to opt-out of the *Smart Meter* program for any reason, contact **DTE**. Your options are limited, will be costly and frustrating as described by some.

VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE

While "*success*" has many definitions, one that Reba McEntire uses is a definition that our neighbors should take to heart:

"To succeed in life you need three things: a wishbone, a backbone and a funny bone."

Our Street & Block Captains efforts are so appreciated in watching out for unoccupied houses on their street and blocks, but we need more volunteers to take an active part in keeping our vacant properties safe and secure. This helps **ALL** of us in retaining best increased-value and appreciation for our homes. If you have information about the owner or property manager of a vacant property, please have the address handy, cross streets noted and keep phone numbers on hand of emergency contacts. Call **911** if you see something suspicious. Share that information with the Task Force. **JOIN THE TASK FORCE!**

Neighbors living next to and/or across the street are the best deterrents to criminal activity. If you can and have a snow blower or kids who could use some extra out-door activity, it would be most helpful to remove the snow from the "sidewalk to the front door" of a vacant home. This helps with security for YOUR property as well, since it shows that someone is watching out and paying attention to comings and goings. . .

The process for obtaining ownership and having absentee owners comply with basic home maintenance and code guidelines seems to be improving. We are fortunate to have our **NPO** (Neighborhood Police Officer) Shawn Childrey as well as dedicated District 1 representatives, Stephanie Young and Reg Reggie Davis on board to help tackle crime and blight. Councilman Tate's staff is another good resource. Their phone numbers are printed in our Grandmonitor, and the Vacant Property Task Force has a printed "*contact sheet*" of phone numbers that might be helpful. I will be happy to drop one off if you call me at **313-836-3736. THANK YOU!**

A "GOOD MANNERS" NOTE:

You are a member of the Grandmont Community of **Good Neighbors**. A friendly, calm, polite, and courteous approach or introduction should always be extended to a new neighbor or to whomever you speak with about a vacant property or other concerns in our community. That said, people do misrepresent themselves, so if you are able to safely get names, vehicle make/model and license plates, and any other pertinent information about someone moving in to a formerly vacant property, that helps "just in case" a paper-trail, time-line is needed to verify Occupancy Certification and that repairs are made to City Code requirements. This is especially important if a home has been vacant for a long time. Our homes in the Grandmont Community deserve good neighbors as well as proper maintenance & timely repairs.
