ENVIRONMENTAL CORNER

Springtime is in the air and with it comes the need to get outside and possibly begin to beautify your environment. Along with the traditional processes of yard maintenance, flower planting and window washing, may come a little painting. A fresh coat of paint where needed gives a personal touch and personal pride to property ownership. Fresh colors that are bright, shiny and beautiful to the eye.



But there is a big difference between a homeowner's and business owner's motivation and the artistic approach to environmental landscaping and the graffiti artist. Yes, spring awakens the creative juices of the street artist that completely and wholeheartedly believes they are doing the community a favor by sharing their unique talents of color shades, subject, message and canvas selection. While I must admit some works are clever, well done and creative, the canvas is wrong.

Sharing these artistic skills on another's property is a Code Violation of the GCA, the City of Detroit and respectable citizenship. These "works of art" only motivate and attract vile, distasteful people and activities and are often gang-related tags. These graffiti tags mark territory and send messages, a street email of intimidation. Not only does this violate our values of family, it gives the impression of blight, community violence and an unsafe environment. The Grandmont Community must react to the possible gang-related potential messages of spring graffiti.

When noticed, contact the Detroit Police who maybe able to translate the symbols and take appropriate actions. Contact Blight Busters immediately! This organization has access to chemicals and cleaning fluids that can safely remove the graffiti. Contact the GCA Security Patrol to be on the lookout for these renegades artist. This is our community and we are not going to give it up to vandals. We know environment beautification and that ain't it!



Pay attention to the bulk pickup, yard waste and recycling pickup dates **GO BLUE!**

Please don't leave debris and yard waste on the street days and days before pickup. This only creates the potential for it to be picked through, tossed around and then we have a bigger mess. **POWER TO THE PEOPLE!**

VACANT PROPERTY UPDATES: PLEASE BE A WATCHFUL NEIGHBOR!

We are working with law enforcement to discourage and eliminate some unscrupulous practices in our communities. This involves mortgage fraud and/or people trying to profit from renting or selling properties they don't own or even trying to move in to properties they don't own. We actively discourage illegal squatting and are working cooperatively and successfully with police and other enforcement agencies to eliminate this crime in our Grandmont/Rosedale neighborhoods.

In some cases, both the "sellers" and "prospective buyers-renters" may be working together and are aware that their schemes are not legal, but decide that it's a good deal for them. It's NOT a good deal for our community. Paid taxes pay for City services that we need and expect. Often taxes don't get paid and properties become neglected and deteriorate more quickly because home-maintenance is ignored or rental property is not inspected or registered as required in the City of Detroit. After awhile, (or if the property will soon be foreclosed), these people move to another house and start the process all over again. Be a watchful neighbor – know the vacant house address (or the address north or south), note any suspicious activity and gather information. Get descriptions of vehicles (color, make, model, etc. and/or license plate numbers if possible. Report any suspicious activities to our Neighborhood Police Officer (NPO) Childrey, the GCA Radio Patrol, or to the Vacant House Task Force. Our community deserves the "GOOD NEIGHBORS" we appreciate and count on to contribute to a better Detroit and safer Grandmont community.

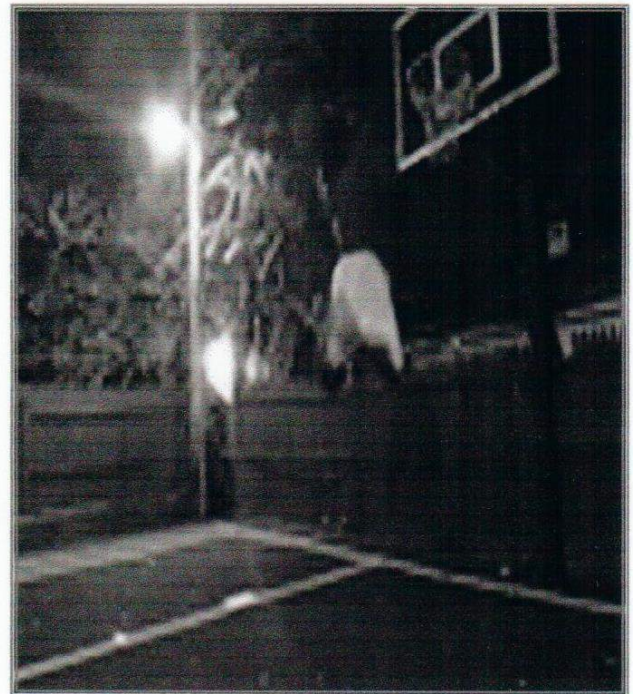

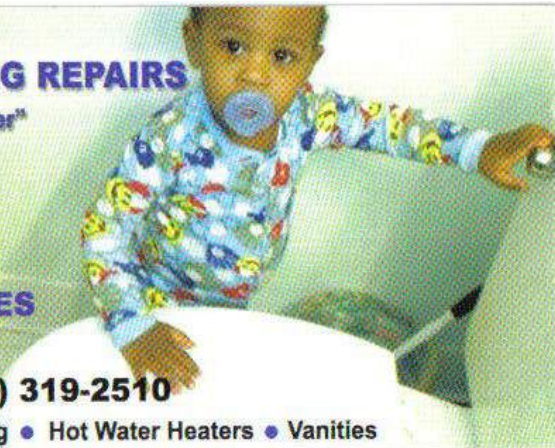
