ENVIRONMENTAL CORNER

pring is upon us and the warmer weather invites us to venture out of our homes. Let's unite as a community and strive to make the Grandmont Community environment beautiful. Begin work on your lawns, front yard gardens, tree maintenance and landscaping in general. Plant flowers, clean up "nature's debris": leaves, tree



branches, dead plants. Mark your calendars when "Bulk and Yard Waste" pickups days are assigned. Place yard waste in "PAPER BAGS" only to guarantee pickup. ADVANCE WASTE will not pickup plastic bags. Eastern Market and big box stores are traditional locations to purchase flowers and plants. Consider supporting local retail stores that carry and sell the same product lines of flowers, plants and fertilizers.

When walking your dog, please use a leash and be accompanied with a poop-scooper. A very informative article was published in the last newsletter about community recycling. Jump on the recycling bandwagon, order a "Blue Canister"



and do you part to help mother-earth. The GCA will enforce City of Detroit Codes that are designed to keep the community and environment clean, attractive and safe. The enforcement of these Codes creates a community that will attract potential homebuyers. If Detroit is to make a comeback, it must start with residential neighborhoods. KEEP OUR COMMUNITY ATTRACTIVE BY NOT:

- ⇒ Parking cars on the lawn
- Parking or leaving disable cars on the street, driveway or backyard. Disabled cars attract rats and squirrels for shelter
- No loud vehicle music that shakes homes, hurts ears and is felt a half a block away
- Discourage young people from walking in the middle of the street
- DO NOT DISCHARGE A WEAPON TO CELEBRATE AT ANY TIME
- Respect your neighbor's driveway entrance and street parking during family cookouts and graduation parties
- Do not litter! Also pick up litter when possible.
- ➡ NO SPEEDING
- ⇒ Parking on the wrong side of the street
- ⇒ Discourage and clean graffiti

VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE

MAY -... Bloom Where You Are Planted!

Spring begins the annual ritual of home and yard maintenance. The Grandmont community can be proud of our homes – and with your efforts – our yards can reflect the beauty of our surroundings. Please consider planting flowers. A hanging basket on the porch or a potted plant on the front steps says welcome to our community.

SISTER ACT — **THANK YOU** to everyone who attended the Sunday, April 9th performance of Sister Act. What a great play! Truly inspiring and passionate acting — and right here in our community. The fundraiser directly benefitted the **VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE (VPTF)**. **THANK YOU!**. Our expected profits, still to be determined, help us with necessary maintenance and securing of vacant properties and vacant lots within our communities. Money raised also allows us to purchase tools and other equipment to secure these properties if needed. Thanks to their hard work and motivation, Chelsea Neblett and Christopher Rodriguez of **GRDC** helped us increase our funds to do even more good work!

Yard Waste collection began April 17th in Grandmont. Please abide by the schedule. Yard Waste should not be placed in the same spot as Bulk. Branches need to be bundled. Plastic bags will NOT be picked up. Brown paper bags or metal containers are what will be collected by Advanced Disposal. And PLEASE take time to clean the street in front of your home – and remove debris from the storm grates to help prevent flooding. Another good practice is to park vehicles OFF the street for safety and security reasons. CARS NEED TO BE PARKED ON CEMENT (parking on the grass is not permitted). Please be a good neighbor and respect this courtesy to our community. Parking on the lawn is environmentally insensitive and promotes rodent nesting as well. Be house proud & community centered. THANK YOU!

On April 1, 2017, the Grandmont Community hosted our annual spring clean-up of Ramsay Park on (**DPD**) Detroit Partnership Day. This year, residents had the pleasure of working along side student volunteers from both the University of Michigan and my daughter's AAU traveling volleyball team; Volleyball Elite.

Together, we raked, swept, trimmed shrubbery and bagged over 160 leaf bags in addition to cleaning the curb-side along the park's fence-line. I believe events like this are very important because it exposes students to great organizations and people in the city and helps dispel the myth that we don't care about our communities. Huge thank you to Ed Smith — Mr. Ramsay (Organizer), the U of M students, Volleyball Elite 14U and Coaches Dana Cooper & Nikki Terry!



WATER PAYMENT ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

The Water Residential Assistance Program, or WRAP, which is administered by Wayne Metropolitan Community Action Agency, provides qualifying customers at or below 150% of the federal poverty threshold with help in paying current and past-due water bills. Eligible customers receive a \$25.00 monthly credit toward current water bills with any arrears suspended for 12-24 months. Customers, who successfully make their monthly payments for six months, receive an additional credit of up to \$350.00 toward the arrearages (up to \$700.00 during a 12-month period). Qualifying residents with water usage exceeding 120 percent of the average household water consumption in the city are also eligible for a free water conservation audit, and up to an additional \$1,000.00 for minor household plumbing repairs based on audit results.

Eligible residents may apply for WRAP by calling 313-386-9727, or learn more at waynemetro.org/wrap.

Assistance up to\$1,000 per household per year. \$25 monthly bill credit + help with arrears.



Home water audit for households above 120% of average usage



Home repairs up to \$1,000 per household to fix minor plumbing issues leading to high usage



Water saving kits and consumer training classes



Supportive WRAP-Around Services

WRAP Participant Qualifications:

- Have income at or below 150% of poverty threshold Provide proof of residency & income Provide renter's proof of responsibility for water on lease Stay current on monthly bill payment

- City of Detroit residents must install a new automatic meter reading device or allow DWSD to install a new meter
