This Rippling Hope Home Repair Program is about building stronger communities and standing together to help one another. The Rippling Hope Ministry is about connecting communities, channeling hope and changing lives. The Rippling Hope Executive Director is Carl Zerweck. This ministry is housed at Rippling Hope Mission House, Rip Joy Road Mission Center and the Northwestern Christian Church @ Ilene and Schoolcraft. This is Grandmont Community Association's 9th year with this program. Rippling Hope has helped many residents not only in our community but other neighborhoods throughout Detroit.

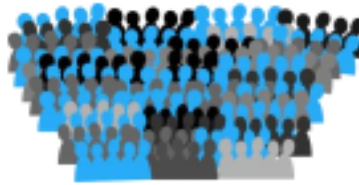

RAMSAY PARK CLEAN-UP Coming Soon! Get Ready...and remember that under all that snow are “buried treasures” namely wind-blown trash, bottles, cans, papers, etc. that will soon surface. Help us keep our neighborhood litter free. **Pick It Up!** Think of this positive action as good exercise for the body, mind, and soul.

FORECLOSURE HELP Every 2nd Wednesday of the month if eligible, attend a FREE Workshop and receive FREE help filling out a Property Tax Exemption Application for Current Taxes Owed! Help is available at GRDC (Grandmont Rosedale Development Corporation, 19800 Grand River (just East of Evergreen). You must bring specific documents and there are income requirements. Call me for more information.

REMINDER - REMINDER - REMINDER: **Please - Please** put your Courville Container/Garbage Can out Thursday evening for our Friday Garbage pick-up and remove the container to the rear of your home promptly after garbage pick-up on Fridays. Your neighbors don't want to (and shouldn't have to) see your container on the street all week. Tickets are expensive (\$200). There is really no excuse for non-compliance with the City Ordinance Sec. 22-2-45 which explains the guidelines. The Improve Detroit App makes ticketing easier, and that's NOT what we want as “Good Neighbors” in the Grandmont Community. We need and expect neighbor cooperation and we appreciate your help. These regulations also apply to Bulk Items and Recycling Containers. **CALL 844-233-8764 Advanced Disposal** if you are unsure of the next collection date, or go to the City of Detroit Website to find this information.

14034 SOUTHFIELD - One More Time! By the time you read this, we can only hope & pray that after too many promises, this house has finally been demolished. Come to the Annual Meeting to see “before” & “after” pictures and learn about plans to beautify this area. Volunteer to help!

DID YOU KNOW? Grandmont is zoned as a Residential Neighborhood. Commercial Trucks and Vehicles are not allowed on private property or on our streets overnight. And parking on the lawn is just wrong – and disrespectful to our community. Also, ongoing Car/Vehicle Repair is NOT ALLOWED in our neighborhood. **ARTICLE V111 RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICTS. Section 61-8-27 states that MOTOR VEHICLE REPAIR IS PROHIBITED AS A HOME OCCUPATION.** Reference Ordinance 193/No.11-05: Any type of repair or assembly of vehicles or equipment with internal combustion engines is prohibited as a home repair occupation as provided for in Sec. 61-12-392 of this Code. Incidental and accessory at-home motor vehicle repair is limited as follows:

1. No motor vehicle may be repaired on residential property outside of a fully enclosed structure, except in the rear yard;
2. No motor vehicle shall be repaired on residential property outside of a fully enclosed structure, except between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 pm;
3. No motor vehicle being repaired on residential property outside of a fully enclosed structure shall appear in a visibly dismantled state, or with parts or components of the vehicle visibly separated from a vehicle, for a period of more than fourteen (14) consecutive days; and
4. No inoperable vehicle shall be stored in a residential yard area, unless the owner of the property has obtained a thirty (30) day sticker from the Police Department Precinct (8th Precinct) where the residential property is located

PLEASE DRIVE SLOWLY – DRIVE SAFELY – AND DRIVE QUIETLY – ON OUR STREETS.

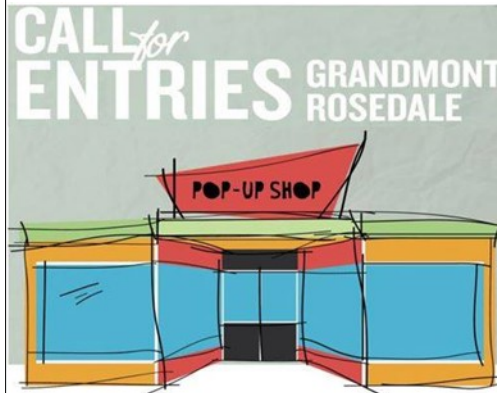

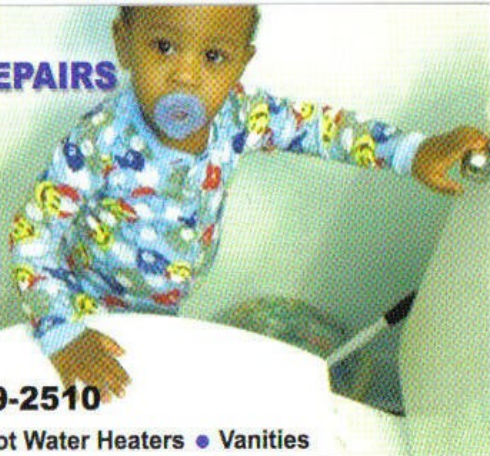
