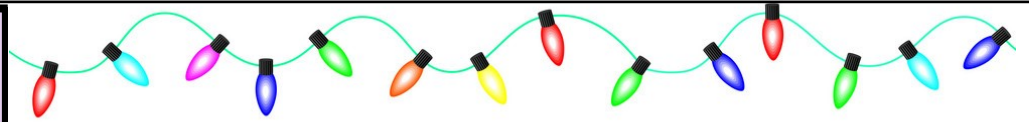

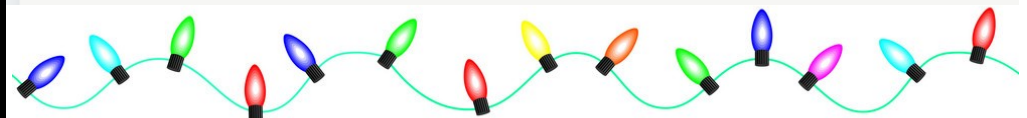

- Page's Bookstore was present as were many local pop-up/businesses to promote early local holiday shopping.

- Also announced was the Handicap Accessible PlayScape at the NRP Community House. Grandmont also secured sponsorship for a TBD upcoming neighborhood event.

Stay Secure at the Holidays

BE SECURITY CONSCIOUS especially during this season:

- **PLEASE** keep your car parked off the street (and off the lawn) especially during these winter months. Don't make it difficult for the wonderful neighborhood street snow service we receive in Grandmont. We need your cooperation to make this service successful and allow for safer passage of emergency and all vehicles. And slow down. You won't win the race. There is no race.
- A good idea (and sanctioned by the Police) is to take a picture of your current Proof of Insurance and Vehicle Registration so you don't have to keep these address-identifying papers in your car. Take a picture of your License Plate as well.
- If you park in your driveway remember to turn your wheels so your car can't be easily pushed to the street. Backing-in gives you the advantage of better visibility of your surroundings - and quick, safer exiting if needed.
- Turn on Your Porch Lights! We especially appreciate all the attractive night lighting in Grandmont. Even with Ring Doorbell, Security Camera's and Alarms, you still want to be able to see suspicious activity and provide as much detail as possible if needed.
- Remember to report crime (and tell your neighbors since crime doesn't stop with you). According to the police, If you don't report it - it didn't happen. If you can't get to the 8th precinct, you can call the non-emergency crime reporting number 313-267-4600 to get a report number and have your information validated and entered into the system.

For any security-related questions or concerns, we suggest that you attend a Grandmont Neighborhood Patrol Meeting (first Monday each month), a GRDC Neighborhood Safety Meeting or a Vacant Property Task Force meeting (both occur every other month). If you're interested in promoting safety and security in Grandmont, this chair is currently empty and awaiting your expertise and energy. We need our neighbors to step and serve in our community to make it a place we all love to live. Are you ready to heed the call?

A CHECKLIST FOR PROTECTING YOUR HOME WHEN YOU'RE AWAY

Last Thanksgiving, **43 million Americans** drove 50 miles or more to carve the turkey with their friends and family. And, last year, **30% of Americans** traveled 50 miles or more from home during the year-end holiday season.

If you're traveling this holiday season, complete this simple checklist to ensure your home is secure when you're away.



UNDER LOCK AND KEY

- Have you locked every door or window, including the door to your garage?
- Have you secured your pet doors (if any)?
- Have you double-checked securing your sliding doors (if any)?
- If you have a home security system, have you activated it?
- Have you locked up your ladders, tools, and lawn furniture?
- Have you put your valuables in a safe or safety deposit box?
- Have you removed any "hidden" keys?



About **40% of burglaries** don't involve forcible entry. Just by properly securing your home, you can reduce your chances of unlawful intrusion.



KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOR

Have you asked a trusted neighbor to:

- Watch your house?
- Hold onto your emergency contact information?
- Collect any newspapers, flyers, or mail that might arrive?
- Park a car in your driveway?



In a survey of burglars, **51% checked for a car** in the driveway before committing their crime.



ANYONE HOME?

- Have you considered putting lights, TVs, or radios on intermittent timers?
- Have you trimmed any overgrown trees or shrubbery?
- Have you considered installing motion-sensing lights?
- Have you broken down any large cardboard boxes?
- Have you avoided posting about your travel plans on social media?

GOOD INFORMATION: If you haven't looked at the City of Detroit (Departments) Website you should. There is a wealth of good information on most topics of concern. You can find out just about anything with ease and a quick click.

There is also a new feature that gives you a snapshot of many of your specific City-Police Contacts as well as your Trash & Recycling information. Go to the new My Home feature on the front screen of www.detroitmi.gov and enter your address. (Some information may need updating, but you can report data issues.)

Financial Counseling
