Vacant Property Update

Good News! We have fewer vacant homes in Grandmont. Ethel Smith and I surveyed our area on Feb 6. We counted approximately 40 vacancies of which 20 or more are rentals and many are in the process of being rehabbed and/ or sold. While that's not reason to celebrate, it is a positive sign that people appreciate where we live and what we have.

TAX FORECLOSURE:

Not so good news...but help is available. Take advantage of the Foreclosure Prevention Resources available in our area at the GRDC Office at 19800 Grand River just east of Evergreen if you need help. Make an appointment! There is no cost to you and your information is kept confidential. In Grandmont, approximately 70 houses are behind on their taxes and could face foreclosure. While many families pay their tax on their own time schedule, PLEASE make sure you check to make certain the taxes you pay go toward any "outstanding amounts" for prior years. Those old, owed taxes could result (and have) in home foreclosure. Communication is essential so unwanted surprises don't happen. If you are on a Payment Plan, ask for help in making sure you are paying the lowest available interest rate. Do not ignore any tax notices you receive.

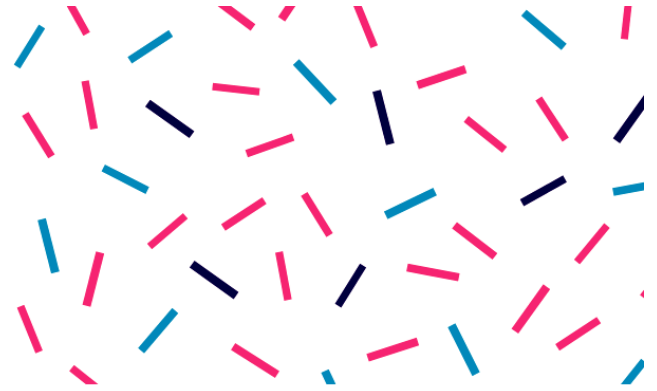

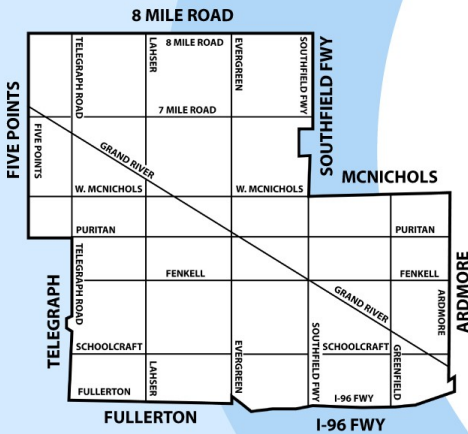

Check window sills don't leak and wash windows. Check door frames. Service AC units.

LANDSCAPING

Prepare and repair any gardening tools. Fertilize lawn.

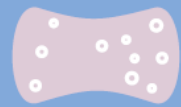


SPRING CLEANING



Store winter gear, clean out clutter. Donate unneeded items. Do a thorough scrub and dust.

HYGIENE



Check for mold, dust and leaks around the house. Also make sure no pests or animals have moved in.

Winter can be tough on our bodies, our cars, and our homes. As we embark upon another change of seasons, a little upkeep now will save you a lot in maintenance down the road. The constant freezing and thawing of winter water might have left your home vulnerable to insects and animals who might still be looking for refuge from the temperature. 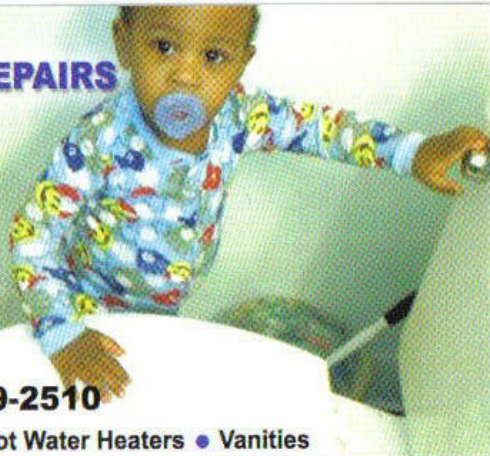
