HOMES FOR SALE IN GRANDMONT ROSEDALE — If you or anyone you know is looking to buy a home in the Grandmont Rosedale area, then be sure to visit our web site, **www.GrandmontRosedale.com**, to see the renovated homes that are available from GRDC. GRDC homes are all move-in ready with many updated features. Down payment assistance is also available to help buyers reduce their out-of-pocket costs and to make home buying more affordable.

In 2013, GRDC will be receiving a grant from the City of Detroit Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP). This grant will enable us to buy and renovate nine more vacant area homes. Eight of the nine homes are being purchased through a cooperative arrangement with the Detroit Land Bank Authority. These long-vacant homes were foreclosed for non-payment of taxes, and will be renovated and ready to purchase this apring and summer. For more information

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH IS VERY IMPORTANT!

There seems to be a recent increase in B & E's, theft from vehicles and robberies of individuals, most armed.

This means there is a continued need for every one of us residents to be sharp and aware. Here are some important things to do to increase our safety:

- 1. Make it a common practice: When you are coming home, circle your block or two and see if there is anything suspicious going on.
 - When you are leaving in the morning, circle your block or two before you leave the neighborhood.
- 2. As always watch someone who is unfamiliar to you on your block and call neighbors on your block and the next block to suggest they do the same. If you do not have a list of phone numbers and email addresses, start making one right now. Anyone would want to be on a list where they knew someone is watching out for them and their homes and would call if anything suspicious was going on. <u>ANYONE</u>. Even if your block does not have a list make your own! Three, Five, Ten people anything is better than none.
- 3. "Patrol" your neighborhood. Look as you drive through your neighborhood. Notice anything that "doesn't look right".
- 4. Keep a notebook in your car so you can write down: color, make and model of suspicious vehicles and most important license plate numbers when you see something of concern. If it is a person, note clothes, height, weight, hair anything that might help the police pick out that person if they came out on one of our calls and saw them walking down the street.
- 5. Call 911 if you see a crime going on or an emergency and be sure to have location number such as a house address; if it is no longer an emergency, call the Crime Reporting Number– 313-267-4600 and ask for the report number to help you track any results in the future.
- 6. If you have an iPhone or other "smartphone", program this e-mail address into your phone: "beinfo@yahoo.com". These are police officers assigned to our area to give special attention to us in NW Detroit. Report this above info to them also. They have asked us repeatedly to: "Don't worry about whether what you are sending is important or not. Let us (the police officers) decide that when we get your information. Just keep us informed of anything suspicious".
- 7. Be a part of the official "EYES AND EARS" in your community by calling your Radio Patrol President and coming to their next meeting to find out if you are able to be a part of this volunteer group in your neighborhood. There is strength in numbers. We are getting stronger and stronger, but are not there yet. Find out how you can help.
