- 3. Grandmont Board of Directors is looking for the Grandmonitor Distribution Chair. Joan Harris-Williams has been chair for years. She and her family are moving out of Grandmont soon. Please contact Cora at (313) 273-7914 if you are interested. Grandmont needs you!



- 4. Completed and sent City of Detroit/Department of Neighborhoods Community Organization Registration Form to Mayor's Office. It was emailed to Stephanie A. Young, District Manager and Reggie Reg Davis, Deputy District Manager. Now, Grandmont Community Association is officially registered with the Mayor's Office Department of Neighborhoods.
- 5. Sent Detroit Recreation Department Special Events Application for our "HOT NIGHTS/COOL JAZZ" submitted to Lynn Shaw, Events Coordinator. Event was approved.
- 6. Attended the 8th Annual Neighborhoods Day Arise Detroit Orientation Meeting on July 29th. Received packet. The packet included: ARISE Detroit banner, \$120 coupon for supplies, street sign, tool kit of resources and information, discounted shopping services, cleanup bags and other services to support our event. The 8th Annual ARISE Detroit Neighborhoods Day is August 2nd.

TO REGISTER FOR THE EVENT, A PLAN HAD TO BE SUBMITTED. THE GCA PLAN WAS TO CUT GRASS AND CLEAN AREAS ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE SOUTHFIELD SERVICE DRIVE BETWEEN KENDALL STREET AND SCHOOLCRAFT.

ARISE DETROIT is a broad-based coalition of community groups. Response was she will schedule the baseball diamonds this week. Brad Dick replied that the signs are done in bulk by our vendors at this point we are still waiting for an increase in numbers.

he name and work of visual artist Ronald Scarbough is well known in the Detroit area. Ron, born in Detroit and the oldest of 11 children, started drawing in kindergarten. By the time he was in third grade, his teachers recommended that he take special art classes. His love for and interest in art grew, and he continued to develop his talent in high school. Ron attended Wayne State University's Center for Creative Studies, where he started drawing children and decided that was what he liked best. However, he was drafted and served as a technical illustrator in the Air Force for four years. That was where he developed his fondness and respect for the pencil and cross-hatch technique.



fter military service, Ron worked as a commercial artist but decided to devote his life to being a fine artist. He exhibited his art in many states, had numerous one-man shows and was part of group shows. Ron captured first place at the Tripoli International Art Fair where he presented one of his works to King Idres of Libya.












Ithough his work has hung in galleries, Ron prefers exhibiting at fairs and street festivals where he can meet the people and "show them, especially younger black kids, they can be artists." It was at an art fair in 1980 that he met OmniArts' founder Bill Mobley, who hired him to take his art to the schools.

on has been profiled in magazine and newspaper articles and has appeared on local TV shows such as "PROFILES IN BLACK". His prints can be found in numerous private residences and many Detroit schools. His original illustrations appear in books, one of which is called "Inside of Me". Ron himself describes his pencil (sometimes ink) drawings as "Norman Rockwell type renderings with an ethnic mix."

FRIENDLY REMINDER ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE:

We are all volunteers, and (UNFORTUNATELY) we are not miracle workers! The Environmental Committee would be contacted after other measures failed to gain appropriate results, or in certain situations, when neighbor friction could be eliminated with our involvement. Plus, there is always strength in numbers.

Resources on hand include DPW direct complaint number (313) 876-0974 for high weeds, abandoned cars, and other environmental enforcement issues. Let the City Inspector investigate and ticket if necessary. This is an anonymous call and will be investigated within 5-8 days. Attending the 1st Thursday of the Month Blight Meetings at the 6th/8th Precinct located at 11450 Warwick (just south of Plymouth Road and east of Evergreen) with Community Relations Officers on hand to listen to neighbor frustrations including noise, dogs, abandoned vehicles, car repair, blight, code and other concerns. It also helps to have the names of Street/Block Captains available as well as handouts describing Blight Code Information/Fines, and a helpful resource/reference sheet with "Who To Call" phone numbers for specific City matters. Please call me at (313) 836-3736 if you would like this information. Remember that it is important to welcome new neighbors to our community first, and then hand them a GRANDMONITOR or Best Practices/Standards Guideline Information Sheet. This can help eliminate misunderstandings once we all realize that Grandmont has high expectations and anticipates neighbor cooperation and has a history of active participation in best solutions.


