NOVEMBER, 2014 PRESIDENT'S REPORT ~ CORA DUNCAN-FOSTER

- Janet Adams, Membership Chair, Organized dues collection on Saturdays. Other volunteers were: Odo Olaf, Robert & Diane Patterson, Bernard & Kathy Morgan, block/ street captains, and I. Great job everyone!
- Our Board of Directors approved a motion to accept Krystal Thurmond and Ethel Smith as new board members. Damon Washington and Richard Berlin have resigned. Krystal Thurmond will be replacing Damon Washington (2016). Ethel Smith will be taking Richard Berlin's place (2015).
- 3. Announcing Ethel Smith as our new Grandmonitor Distribution and Street/Block Captain Chair. We met with Joan to get the particulars. We greatly appreciate your volunteerism Ethel!



- 4. Sent thank you email to Mayor Duggan for the demolition of 14574 Abington.
- 5. Borrowed paint and supplies from **GRDC**. Odo covered the graffiti that was on the building at Grandmont and Grand River. It looks pretty good! Thanks Odo!
- 6. Announcing Charlotte Wright's nomination for the **GRDC** Board. Sent email to the **GRDC** President W. Frey approving her acceptance and listing her many qualifications.
- 7. Noticed city workers removing sidewalk blocks and replacing them with new cement. Was told our city is repairing the problem in Grandmont where the tree root has been pushing up the sidewalk. Normally, residents are responsible for repairing the sidewalk in front of their home. However, the City of Detroit has graciously decided to repair the sidewalk at no cost to the homeowner.
- 8. Sent thank you emails on behalf of Grandmont to Councilman James Tate and Stephanie Young, District One Manager, for always keeping us abreast of all city important information and assisting us with Grandmont issues. Their availability and commitment to our community is commendable. Forwarded emails to the Mayor's office.
- 9. Noticed wood left on street after bulk pick up; called Advance Disposal at 844-233-8764. Wood was removed.
- 10. Attended Neighborhood Safety Meeting on Thursday, October 23rd. Henry Ward, Representative from the Detroit Police Department's Animal Control Unit, presented "*Legal Responsibilities for Pet Owners*". Some information is below:
 - · Dogs on leash can be in a public park.
 - Dog owners will be ticketed if their pet poops on private property.
 - Unlawful for a person to own more than four dogs or cats over the age of four months at a residence.
 - A dog barking from 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM in the morning is a violation.
 - Since January, there were: 737 bites, 1,312 dogs impounded, and 7,000 dogs licensed.
 - Cannot ticket a neighbor if their dog is behaving in a threatening manner behind fence on its property.
 - Phone Detroit Animal Control at 313-224-6356 for more information.
- 11. Attended District One Detroit City Council Meeting chaired by Councilmember James Tate on Saturday, October 25, 2014. Speakers with information are listed below:

 consultation and receive free energy products.
 - Janice Winfrey, City Clerk/Department of Election, reminded us to read "Your Election Connection Newsletter" which is sent from her office. She gave information about the absentee and early voting process. Phone number is 313-876-0190 for assistance.
 - Douglas Dillard, Northwest Consortium Group, explained that the Meijer's on Grand River will be completed in June 2015. Four months before its completion, the unemployed can apply for employment. Phone 313-520-0482.

Animal Bites:

Get the home address of the animals owner or the location the animal was last seen.

Have as much of the bite victim's information as possible, including:

Name, Address, Phone #, Date of Bite

Call Animal Control and Care at (313) 224-7135. Provide the above information so an official bite report can be documented and appropriate actions taken.

Reporting Strays:

Get the address or location where the stray(s) were seen.

Call Animal Control and Care at (313) 224-6356 and give the following information:

Animal location: address or street name where animal may be located (i.e., alley, vacant house, etc.)

Is caller holding a stray, or is this a pet you own and are giving up?

Licensing a Dog:

Take your dog to your veterinarian to receive a rabies vaccination. After your dog is vaccinated, the veterinarian will give you a vaccination certificate so you can get a license.

Mail a copy of the vaccination and the appropriate fee to Animal Control and Care at the address below. You may also purchase a license by bringing a copy of the vaccination and the appropriate fee to:



• The Michigan Medical Marijuana Act provides the use of this drug under State law for medical reasons only. The registered qualifying patients must be diagnosed by a physician as having a debilitating medical condition but not limited to cancer, glaucoma, HIV/AIDS, Crohn's disease, Alzheimer disease, and symptoms such as severe and chronic pain, severe nausea, seizures, etc. A registered primary caregiver must assist the patient. The physician must provide written certification or otherwise state that the patient is likely to receive therapeutic benefit from the medical use of marijuana, in the normal course of a bona fide physician-patient relationship.

While we want to be even more careful because of the holiday season, these safety tips should be used AT ALL TIMES:

- Never leave items (i.e. coins, purse, cell phones, GPS) or anything criminals might find of value in your cars! Items you need during travel but not with you during shopping should be placed items in the trunk at a different location than your destination. Thugs are watching you place these things in your trunk.
- NEVER DRIVE DIRECTLY TO YOUR RESIDENCE FROM SHOPPING. Drive around the block and stop briefly on a block you don't live so you can see if you are being followed.
- When you get to your residence, call to let someone (family or neighbor) know you are coming in the house or blow your horn prior to exiting your vehicle.
- Carry only a limited amount of cash; try and use debit or credit cards. Thugs are watching to see who's carrying large amounts of cash.
- Try not to shop alone. Pay attention to your surroundings while walking through malls; look around to see if you may be followed from store to store.
- Please make sure you never drive with less than half tank of gas and when purchasing gas never leave children or keys in your car. Try to take someone with you when you purchase gas. Please get your gas in the day light hours.
- ALWAYS LET SOMEONE KNOW WHERE YOU ARE!

If you're traveling:

- Make sure your car doors are locked.
- Travel on well-lit roads.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Be cautious of accident scams such as intentional bumping of vehicles. (If this happens and you feel uneasy drive to the nearest police station)

Leaving your home / Out for the evening:

- Set an automatic timer for your lights.
- Ask your neighbor to watch your home, shovel the walks, pick-up newspapers, collect mail, and park in the driveway from time to time.
- Be sure to hide any gifts that may be left in the house while you are away.
- Turn on lights and a radio or the TV so that it appears that someone is
- Lock all doors and windows while ou're out, even if you plan to be way for a few minutes.
- Do not place packages or gifts near windows or in other high-visibility

If you're shopping:

- Don't let your guard down just because you are rushing.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Be prepared when approaching your vehicle; have your keys ready
- Park in well-lighted areas and as close to the store as possible.
- Hide packages in the trunk or under the

- If possible do not carry a purse, put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants
- Wear comfortable clothes and shoes.
- Beware of con artists. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
- If you take your children shopping, teach them to go to a police officer or a store security guard if they get separated or
