
- 3. We need a Street Captain for Abington Street. So come on and get involved! WE NEED YOU!
- 4. At the annual meeting, we will be electing new Board members. I just know there is a lot of talent here in our community! Grandmont needs you! So right now email your bio to Charlotte Wright, our Secretary! Her email is clwright777@gmail.com.
- **5.** At the salute to the 6th / 8th Precinct's Citizens' Radio Patrol Dinner, Grandmont Community Association's Radio Patrol received a "Certificate of Appreciation" signed by Mayor Mike Duggan.
- **6.** I requested and received City of Detroit "Spirit Award" from Councilmember James Tate's office for Dominique Taylor, our scholarship winner. A thank you email was sent to him and his staff for the certificate.
- 7. The house at 14670 Woodmont has been demolished. This left a vacant lot. A Woodmont resident was told that the medical clinic at 14601 Grand River is making this area a parking lot. Resident doesn't want to be living next to a parking lot. I was told that a small part of the land near the alley may belong to the Land Bank Authority. Can the medical center place a parking lot in a resident area? Is this legal? Are there zoning restrictions? Please assist. This was emailed to both Councilmember James Tate and Rodney Liggons, Land Bank Authority Community Relations. A phone call is forthcoming.
- 8. The leaf bags were left by the ADVANCE DISPOSAL COMPANY. This prompted me to phone Stephanie Young, District One Manager Mayor's Office. She contacted DPW Director Rod Brundidge and came here to inspect the problem. The bags are gone. I sent her a thank you email.
- I sent a thank you email to Tom Goddeeris, GRDC Executive Director, for answering our concerns at our December Community Meeting.
- **10.** Stephanie Young, District One Manager Mayor's Office, mentioned that 25 boards are available to board up vacant houses.
- 11. CDAD and MICHIGAN COMMUNITY RESOURCES invite Detroit block clubs, neighborhood associations, and other similar community-based organizations to apply for a unique opportunity to gain new skills and build capacity to positively impact the quality of life in our neighborhood. From January to June 2015, those accepted will join a cohort of similar groups that receive one-on-one support from CDAD and MCR staff based on our organization's needs. Examples include help with budgeting, evaluation, goal setting, collaboration, meeting facilitation, and many more topics. Participating organizations will have opportunities to connect and learn from each other and similar groups across the city. In addition, groups will also have access to a series of free workshops. I applied for Grandmont, so lets' get involved!

NEW MOBILE APPS CONNECT RESIDENTS WITH CITY SERVICES

NEW BUS APP FROM DDOT SHOWS NEXT BUS ON MAP & GIVES ARRIVAL TIME:

Another new app for city residents was released this week. This app from DDOT maps the next two bus arrivals at your bus stop. It has several new features:

- See what time the next bus will arrive at a specific bus stop
- · Look on a map and see where the bus is in relation to a specific bus stop
- Tell the route and time the next bus will arrive at a particular bus stop location
- Plan a trip by seeing which buses and transfers to take to get from one location to another
- Send comments and suggestions (including pictures) to DDOT to help improve DDOT service



If you don't have a smartphone, you can still track your next bus via text messages using "Text My Bus" to provide the estimated arrival time of the next bus in the form of a text message. Just text your location (major cross streets) to **50464** and follow the prompts to get your specific route and bus information.

NEW APP TO REPORT WATER PROBLEMS TO DWSD:

The City of Detroit has partnered with "SEECLICKFIX" to develop the Detroit Delivers mobile app for reporting problems to the city for repair. Residents can easily report potholes, water main breaks, damaged traffic signs, broken traffic signals, downed trees, abandoned cars and much more. This app uses your location and gives you a menu of common quality-of-life conditions to choose from in your service request. You can also upload photos with your report to help the City staff quickly identify the problem. If you have a smartphone, you can download the apps as follows:

Every other Wednesday these refuse collectors line some of the



streets in our community with recyclable materials: glass, paper, metal and plastic for pickup. There are numerous reasons why the residents of the Grandmont Community should be the spearhead of a program that helps in a small way to save our fragile environment and eco system.

The movement to extract materials that take thousands of years of years to decompose in landfills began decades ago. Unfortunately the citizens of Detroit have not had a formal process or program to educate nor collect these materials over the years. Several other cities within the tri-county area have had curbside recycling pickup for years. As the largest city in the state, Detroit needs to educate and empower residents and begin taking the first steps to support a formal recycling program. The journey of 1,000 miles begins with the first step.

VISIT OUR NEIGHBORHOOD LIBRARY WHO WAS HENRY CHANEY?

The Chaney Branch was named in honor of the first Director of the Detroit Public Library, Henry Chaney. Professor Chaney served as Director from 1865 to 1878. The Chaney Branch opened to the public on June 28, 1955. The site was previously a bookmobile stop.

Currently, the branch serves a diverse population. The collection includes books and audio tapes. There is a strong emphasis on African-American literature and testing materials. Educational and entertaining programming, including book discussion groups, computer classes, and story hours, is available for children and adults throughout the year.


