- 4. Neighborhood Safety Meeting was held at 18445 Scarsdale St., on Thursday, March 26, 2015. Pamela Drake, Chief Investigator presented. The Office of the Chief Investigator (OCI) serves as the investigative staff for the Detroit Board of Police Commissioners. The OCI directs the process for receiving and investigating citizen complaints against the Detroit Police Department and its personnel. The staff includes both civilian and sworn investigators. If you have a concern regarding the performance of any Detroit Police employee, you have the right to file a complaint using the following methods:
  - In-person Visit or Mail Contact Form: The office of the Chief Investigator located at 65 Cadillac Square, 40th Floor, Detroit, MI 48226. You may also visit any Detroit Police entity.
  - Telephone: (313) 596-2499, Fax: (313) 596-2482
  - Online: www.ci.detroit.mi.us/police commissioners
  - Complaint Form: Complaint forms are available at all Detroit Public Libraries and Detroit Police Department Districts.
  - You may also have someone else file the complaint form on your behalf.

The staff of the **OCI** will contact you regarding your complaint once you have submitted this contact form. The form can be hand delivered, mailed or faxed to the **OCI**. If you decide to speak with someone, you will be referred to a supervisor and provided with a citizen complaint number. All citizen complaints are forwarded to the **OCI** for investigation. Within seven days of receiving the complaint, the **OCI** will mail the complainant a copy of the completed Citizen Complaint Report. You will receive information periodically regarding the status of your complaint until the investigation is completed. The finding are then reviewed and approved by a member of the Detroit Board of Police Commissioners. After approval, the **OCI** will notify you of the investigative findings.

5. Attend the Neighborhood Safety Meeting on Thursday, April 23, 2015 at 6:30 PM - 8:00 PM at the North Rosedale Park Community House. The **Special Assessment District** topic will be discussed.


