VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE

Words of wisdom: "GREAT THINGS COME FROM LITTLE THINGS." I read this in a Detroit Free Press article by Josh Linkner where he commented that the daily habits we practice are the ingredients to the success we seek and not, as many people assume, by random chance. And as Aristotle once said, "We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act, but a habit."

BE HOUSE PROUD ... BE GRANDMONT COMMUNITY PROUD!

Remember that a first impression can make a lasting impression. Please take some extra time to clean and spruce up your home and surroundings just in time for our Annual Arts and Craft Fair in combination with our Family Fun Jazz in the Park. This year's event will be held Saturday, August 1, 2015 from 12 Noon -7:00 PM in Ramsay Park on Longacre one block south of Grand River. With your help and support, our neighborhood will shine. Keep our neighborhood looking its best, Art Fair day and every day! Love where you live!



16831 GRAND RIVER - BURNED HARDWARE STORE: We have been contacting City departments as well as our District 1 representatives about the blighted condition and increased litter in and around this building. Tickets have been issued. The posted demolition sign in December, and then January, seemed to be a hopeful indicator that the building would soon be demolished. I'm cautiously optimistic that good news in the form of a demolition crew will be delivered soon. Stay tuned. STAY POSITIVE!

ANNUAL MEETING QUESTIONNAIRE: We will meet in late May or early June to go over the many comments and suggestions from the neighborhood survey that was distributed at our Annual Meeting April 11th. We need and appreciate your feedback, comments, thoughts and ideas to make our community a more stronger and welcoming neighborhood. As always, new ideas should bring new people – new energy – to help transform ideas into reality. When you fill out your dues application, you are always encouraged to write down any concerns you have so that our GCA Board can target matters that are important to the community.

NO PLASTIC BAGS!: One recurring issue seems to be that people are not yet aware that ADVANCED DISPOSAL will not take yard waste or bulk items in plastic bags. If you are putting leaves or branches in black plastic bags, you will need to take them to the Southfield Yard yourself and most likely open them to show that the bags contain only leaves and branches. Make it easy on yourself and your neighbors by using the required paper yard waste bags. Pay attention to the scheduled pickup dates for our bulk and yard waste which is every other Monday. The scheduled dates are posted in this issue under "CITY SERVICES" as well as on the back calendar: you can also call ADVANCED DISPOSAL at 844-233-8764 and they will give you the correct date of our next scheduled pickup. Although we try to first notify neighbors who may not realize what ADVANCED will and will not take, we are taking steps to eliminate rodent problems as well as littered streets by asking that code enforcement inspections be routinely made.

SAFETY and SURROUNDINGS: We always need to be present in the neighborhood. That means be watchful and aware of your surroundings. PARKING: We encourage you to park in your garage or driveway and not in the street for safety and security concerns. Warmer weather means more children playing and it only takes a minute for a child to run into the street. Parked cars make it more difficult to see that happening. Streets free of vehicles also allows easier passage for police and emergency vehicles. Suspicious cars are more easily identified. Be prepared for the unexpected.

SLOW DOWN, YOU MOVE TOO FAST STAY SAFE AND SLOW DOWN!

Some other things that make Spring a smoother transition into Summer is to be a considerate neighbor. Celebrations, BBQ's (in the backyard please!), open-windows, children playing, dogs being walked, etc. are part of this summer transition. While keeping your spirits up, please keep the noise down.

- PARTIES AND CELEBRATIONS: Keep the noise level to a minimum. Excessively loud, amplified parties are an illegal nuisance.
- CAR RADIO AND OTHER SOUND SYSTEMS: Be a good neighbor and keep the volume down.
- ▼ VERY-EARLY MORNING LAWN CUTTING is discouraged.
- PORTABLE BASKETBALL HOOPS: These are meant for the backyard and not legal on the streets. Parents, please be aware of the danger of speeding cars and other dangers and remind your children and teens to play in the backyard and not in the street. (Detroit City Ordinance Article 1 Section 50-1-12 states..."No person shall play any game in any street, alley, or public place...")

STANDARD TIME: 8:00 PM - 15 Years & Under; 9:00 PM - 16 & 17 Years, Sunday - Thursday

11:00 PM - 16 & 17 Years, Friday & Saturday

CLARIFICATION: → The April, 2015 President's Report printed in the June, 2015 issue of the GRANDMONITOR should have noted that the \$4,000.00 Michigan Community Resources Grant we received is only – and specifically – allocated for beautification and tree planting of vacant lots on the Southfield Service Drive, which can include plantings and landscaping near the Lyndon Avenue overpass bridge. It cannot be used for securing or maintaining vacant homes.

But wait...






