GCA PRESIDENT'S REPORT ~ MARK JANUSCH

The 2015 Art Fair was a big success. We had great weather and great music by Roger Tucker and the ¾ Steps. This year we combined the Art Fair and JazzFest into one event. A special thank you to Jomo King and his team of volunteers who made this event a reality. Well done, Jomo!

Ramsay Park was awarded a five star rating by ADOPT-A-PARK for the week ending July 31st. This award was from the Mayor's office. A special thank you to Ed Smith and his hard working team of volunteers who keep the Park beautiful all year. I mentioned to Ed that this is the best I have seen the Park look in the 40 years that I have been a Grandmont Resident.

A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT (S.A.D) TOWN HALL MEETING IS SCHEDULED FOR THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 17th AT 7 PM AT BUSHNELL CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

Finally, let me introduce myself. I was elected President by the GCA board on July 11th replacing Jomo King who stepped down for personal reasons. I have been a Grandmont resident for the past 40 years. I was a founding member and past president of the GRDC. I am married to my wife Julie and we have two grown children living in Santé Fe and Chicago. I accepted this position knowing that we have challenges ahead with trying to provide services with a fixed income stream from our annual dues collection and with expenses that keep going up. Street Snow removal alone consumes 60% of our dues. If S.A.D. is adopted, it will help tremendously because only 50% of Grandmont residents pay their dues. When you consider the services we provide for \$25 per year, it is a bargain!

Finally, you will be getting your annual SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL invoice from GREENER STILL. Please don't ignore that invoice. It is important that we keep our sidewalks clear for Letter Carriers, children walking to school and others that depend on clear sidewalks. GREENER STILL provides this service even though some blocks only have 5 or 6 houses paying for this service. How much longer can they keep on providing this service? If S.A.D. is adopted this will be part of the package starting in the fall of 2016.
