PRESIDENT'S REPORT ~ MARK JANUSCH

November, 2015

On Saturday October 17th at Bushnell Congregational Church, Kathy Morgan, with an able assist from Ethel Smith, hosted our first annual FALL HARVEST PARTY for Grandmont residents. There was cider and donuts for the adults and Halloween treats and pumpkin decorating activities for the children. Approximately 40 Grandmont families attended and got to know one another, with some leaving early to watch the U of M vs. MSU game. The party was a success! Thank you Kathy and to those who offered a helping hand and donated candy for this seasonal event.

S.A.D. Proposal: on October 27th the **GRDC** will meet with the Assessor's office to present the Special Assessment District Proposal. If they approve the wording and content of the proposal, petitions will start to circulate in November.

<u>What is S.A.D.</u>?: S.A.D. is a Special Assessment District that would provide enhanced security and street and sidewalk snow removal in the five neighborhoods. If adopted by 51% of the 5300 homeowners that make the five neighborhoods, it would appear on your 2016 tax bill as a special assessment similar to your trash collection assessment. It would last for seven years and then expire. If you are a homeowner and favor S.A.D., sign the petition. If you do not want S.A.D. do not sign the petition.

To those faithful Grandmont residents who have paid their annual **GCA** dues for 2015, thank you for your support! To those who have yet to pay, there is still time. We're counting on you to fill out an application (printed on page 3 in **THE GRANDMONITOR** each month) for **GCA** membership and either drop if off at your Block Captain's house or mail it to our P.O. Box 27790, Detroit, Michigan 48227. Please make your check or money order payable to the **GCA**.

To meet the needs of our community, the Grandmont Community Association is now offering electronic bill payment of yearly annual dues as an online payment solution. Now you can enjoy the convenience of paying your yearly annual dues and receiving your receipt instantly though PayPal. You will then receive a **GCA** membership card for 2015.

Finally, I have been busy getting quotes for street snow removal and printing services from new suppliers in an effort to maintain service and quality and to save the association money and help our cash flow. I cannot do this alone; I cannot keep cutting expenses and still offer services. We have already had to cancel the College Scholarship this year and the annual Christmas Appreciation Luncheon. But we simply cannot cut our way to a balanced budget. The Grandmont community needs your support this year more than ever. Please pay your dues, a mere \$25 each year (\$10 for Southfield & Longacre Apartments), half of what Rosedale Park and Grandmont 1 charge their residents for dues. Snow Removal alone consumes 80% of our dues collection. The Grandmontor pays for itself with advertising dollars collected. Without your support we may have to forego street Snow Removal, which we as a Board do NOT want to do this winter. Please pay your dues and even consider paying ahead for next year. Together, we can maintain the level of service that we have all come to expect in Grandmont, and keep this a great place to live.

WAYNE COUNTY AUCTION UPDATE:

FYI – The September, 2015 Wayne County Tax Auction has resulted in nine homes being sold within Grandmont for back taxes. Eight (8) of those houses were sold for substantially more than the original tax dollars owed. The October, 2015_Wayne County Auction is still ongoing by the deadline for this November issue of the **Grandmonitor**. Currently, there are ten houses and four vacant lot parcels listed for sale in the October, 2015 tax auction within the Grandmont neighborhood.

Our Task Force Group is tracking buyer information to observe that city codes and zoning regulations are being complied with and new owners become familiar with our community best practices, high standards, and pride in property preservation.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT UPDATE

October, 2015

Homeowners in the Grandmont Community and the five neighborhoods comprising the Grandmont Rosedale Development Corporation (GRDC) will be given a unique and ground breaking opportunity soon to chart a course of action for the safety and security of their home and family. This opportunity is the result of years of hard work determining how best to use this area's purchasing power and our homes' investment value to provide for an enhanced neighborhood living environment. The outcome of this program means more economical use of funds to cover winter snow service, on streets and sidewalks and to provide another layer of security by a more robust police and security presence in our neighborhoods.

The value presented for the work will take place in a very democratic and face-to-face contact atmosphere. Petitioners will be going door to door to inform homeowners of this safety and security program, how individuals will interact with that program and the costs and conditions that will apply to create, manage and set performance metrics for the programs.

There will definitely be a cost to this buy in; you definitely get what you pay for in this life.

The big difference which everyone should appreciate is that this "ASK" comes from your friends and neighbors in your community. This is not a top down imposition against your will by some distant governing body.

It is clearly an opportunity of choice, equity and transparency. **CHOICE:** since you will be asked to sign the petition if you are in favor of this program. No one is twisting your arm, you have free will to decide what this program means to you, the value it has for you and that you will be joining with large numbers of other homeowners to move forward on matters of safety and security. Additionally, providing winter snow service for both sidewalks and street will enhance the appeal of our neighborhoods where concerns about hazardous weather conditions and the ease of access for first responders and emergency equipment are of paramount importance.

EQUITY: Anyone who is remotely aware of the great number of hours volunteers spend, in each of the five communities, to go door to door to collect neighborhood dues that fund the needed programs of our residents understands that not everyone is willing to pitch in and help with budget items of safety and security. Unfortunately, some residents feel that someone else will do the heavy lifting for them while they stand aside community efforts that seek to promote an attractive and stronger neighborhood. As dues collection goes, volunteers must still go actively to residents to engage them and collect their dues. In a perfect world residents would voluntarily pay their Block or Street Captains or Board Members directly. Needless to say, none of those Block and Street Captains or Board Members has reported any form of stampede to their front doors by neighbors ready and willing to pay. Under this program the determined assessment would be included in the homeowner property taxes, so that all can join in equally and fairly in the payment, pursuit and responsibilities of the goals of this program.

Thirdly, TRANSPARENCY: will be a watchword for all concerned. No one wants to send money off to City Hall, Lansing or Washington and then wonder if it will come back in needed services or how money matters will be evaluated, managed or put to proper use. If you have ever not responded to your elected representatives on issues that matter to you because you could not get to Washington, Lansing or even downtown, this, then, is a whole new concept. Initiated from the ground up, by fellow homeowners and neighbors who live near and with you, this is as close as you will get to interacting with town hall governance. It will be your opportunity to protect and defend what you hold dear, that is, a community and neighborhood program to advance a new way of living and governing your neighborhood and community for the future in the 21st Century.






