PRESIDENT'S REPORT ~ MARK JANUSCH

December, 2015

GOOD NEWS! Due to a series of cost cutting actions and a new snow plowing contractor, we will be able to offer street snow plowing in Grandmont for the 2015-2016 Season. **ALL SEASONS LANDSCAPING** will be doing the plowing this year. The owner is Vincent Ford who lives in Rosedale Park and he has plowed Grandmont #1 for the last 17 years. **GREENER STILL** will continue to do the sidewalks which are separate from street plowing and each household should have already received an invoice in the mail for this season. Please pay **GREENER STILL** for clearing your sidewalks; it is NOT part of the street plowing that the GCA provides to Grandmont residents.

Also, we have a new printer. **SPARTAN FORMs** is now doing the printing of the **GRANDMONITOR**. You may have noticed that the quality and clarity of the printing and photos has improved. These and other cost cutting actions will save **\$5000** annually. Because of these savings, we will still be able to offer key services to our GCA households. To those neighbors who have paid their annual dues for 2015 and beyond, **THANK YOU** and **BLESS YOU** for making this important investment in our Grandmont community. Truly, it is **YOUR** support combined with changing contractors that has made the continuance of street snow plowing possible! To all those residents who have not yet paid, please deliver your dues payment of **\$25** to your Block Captain or mail it to the GCA, P.O. Box 27790, Detroit, MI, 48227. Make out your check or money order payable to "**GCA**". Also **PAYPAL** is another way to pay your dues. There is **STILL** time and your support is very much needed! The budget has been trimmed and further cuts are not an option. So please follow through and pay your annual GCA dues!

REGARDING S.A.D: The **GRDC** will be hosting a series of five Town Hall meetings for the five neighborhoods that makeup the Special Assessment District (S.A.D.). I encourage all residents to please attend meetings scheduled in the Grandmont area to get more information about what services will be offered and what the cost will be for each household. This is your chance to learn more and to ask your questions. Two of the meetings will be held Tuesday, December 8th at **GREATER EBENEZER MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH**, 18751 Fenkell Ave, Detroit, MI from 6 PM - 8 PM and Saturday, December 12th at **GRDC's Main Office**, 19800 Grand River Avenue, Detroit, MI from 10:30 AM - 1 PM. Petitions will start circulating in a few weeks; each registered homeowner will then have the chance to sign the petition if they favor S.A.D. If you do not favor S.A.D., do not sign the petition. It's THAT SIMPLE. For S.A.D. to happen, it will take 51% of the 5300 homeowners that make up our district to sign the petition. I urge you to attend these meetings and get your questions answered and form your own conclusion.

FINAL THOUGHTS ON S.A.D: Just before I emailed my report to the editor, I received a call from one of Grandmont's senior citizens. She told me about her difficulty paying her property taxes with her fixed income composed of Social Security and a small pension. She mentioned that she has lived here for 41 years and would not be able to afford a higher tax bill and would have to move. This concerns me. No one wants any of our residents to have to move from their homes because they can't afford their taxes! I urged her to please attend the Town Hall meeting and let the residents know about her situation. One voice just might be loud enough to sway opinion and help the undecided form their conclusion on the S.A.D. proposal. I have tried to remain neutral as your GCA president, but I, too, am concerned about increasing taxes. I have also just learned that the cost of S.A.D. will be \$247 per year. That is a total tax bill of \$1729 spread out over the next 7 years, the length of time that S.A.D. will exist. In contrast, the GCA has managed to provide snow removal from the collected annual dues of just \$25 per household per year. Coach Muhammad and faithful members of his Radio Patrol do an excellent job as they continue to volunteer their time patrolling our neighborhood. I know they would welcome more volunteers. Why not make it a resolution to join them in the New Year!

It has been a tough and challenging year, but your elected GCA Board Members have risen to the challenges and always with our community's best interests in mind. I thank them for contributing their time and talents and for all their hard work. I also want to thank all the hard working Block Captains who collect dues and distribute the **GRANDMONITORS** each month. Finally, I want to thank Phil Foster whose advertising revenue pays for the printing cost of the **GRANDMONITOR** and generates positive cash flow each month. **THANKS TO ONE AND ALL** that work behind the scenes in our neighborhood and make Grandmont a great place to live.

ANOTHER LAYER OF SERVICE PROVIDED TO ENHANCE THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR GRANDMONT

GRANDMONT ROSEDALE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT (S.A.D.) UPDATE:

Each resident can now take an active role in participating and signing the petition for the Special Assessment District.

The Special Assessment District geographic area for Grandmont Rosedale residential boundaries includes Grandmont Community Association, Grandmont #1 Improvement Association, Minock Park Block Club Association, North Rosedale Park Civic Improvement Association and Rosedale Park Improvement Association.

The Scope of Services provided are security and snow removal. Snow removal will consist of the plowing of streets whenever a snow fall of 3" or more occurs within a 24-hour period. All streets will be plowed within 12 hours of a 3" or greater accumulation, but not before it ceases to fall. Sidewalks will be brushed whenever a snow fall of 2" or more occurs within a 24-hour period. All sidewalks shall be cleared within 12 hours of a 2" or greater accumulation, but not before it ceases to fall. Security services include a day patrol of one DPD Officer in a DPD vehicle and one armed security officer in one marked security vehicle. A night patrol includes two DPD officers in one DPD vehicle and one marked security officer in one security vehicle.

The annual cost assessment for the Special Assessment District is as follows:

COST SHARE: \$241.48

PER PARCEL: + 2.41 (city admin. fee)

TOTAL COST: \$243.89

(A breakdown of the cost will be provided at the Town Hall Meetings).

There will be a total of five Town Hall Meetings scheduled to explain the Special Assessment District for Grandmont Rosedale in detail. During the meetings, residents will be able to ask questions, gain additional knowledge, volunteer and sign the resident parcel petition for the Grandmont Rosedale Special Assessment District.

In the month of December 2015, there will be two Special Assessment District Meetings:

Tues, December 8th at Greater Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church, 18751 Fenkell Ave, Detroit, MI from 6 PM - 8 PM.

Sat. December 12th at GRDC MAIN OFFICE at 19800 Grand River Ave., Detroit, MI from 10:30 AM - 12 PM.

Please plan to attend the Special Assessment Meeting in the upcoming months.

THE HOLIDAY SEASON IS HERE. PLEASE SHARE THESE SAFETY/SHOPPING TIPS WITH YOUR FAMILY AND FRIENDS!!!

- Never put gifts in your car and leave them unattended. If you have to go back into the mall . . . move your car to the other side of the mall
- Be mindful of your alcohol intake during holiday parties . . . the rule of thumb is one drink per hour
- Try to use debit cards when possible
- Learn to shop online . . . safe web pages have HTTPS at the top. The 'S' stands for "SECURE"
- Use valet when shopping at the mall
- Never park your car near the outer reaches of the parking lot . . . this is where the crimes are happening
- Use mall escorts to walk you to your car after dark
- Always shop in groups
- Never take large purses with you to shop . . . you will become a target
- Look around before you enter or exit your car
- street Get your gas during rush hour or in the morning when people are going to work . . . never at night
- if you see anyone loitering or looking suspicious . . . keep going (for ATM's, Gas Stations, etc.)
- if someone bumps your car and you have a BAD feeling . . . go straight to the police station

At least 51% of area property owners must sign a petition in favor of establishing a SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT for it to become a reality. If enacted, the SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT would provide security patrol and snow removal for all residential streets and sidewalks. Look for house parties, door to door volunteers and other efforts to be sure Grandmont Rosedale has the necessary signatures from property owners to make our neighborhoods a Special Assessment District! - * Never resist if a gun is produced during a robbery . . . GIVE THEM YOUR STUFF!!
- Plug your space heater directly into the wall
- All of your electrical cords should be 'U.L.' approved
- Have a company "sweep" your chimney if you have not used it regularly during the last two or three years
- Never drive too close to the car in front of you so you won't get boxed in . . . allow enough room to pull out


