2015 RIPPLING HOPE UPDATE

RIPPLING HOPE COMMITTEE REPORT:

The RIPPLING HOPE NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION LEADERS meeting was held 10:30 AM - 12 NOON on Saturday, December 12th at the Northwestern Christian Church, 13650 Ilene St. in Detroit. The purpose of this meeting was to review the application and home repair process for 2016, and to give us a status report on 2015. The RIPPLING HOPE TEAM still has about 70 residents' home repairs to complete in Detroit. The reason why the home repairs were not complete is because the team boarded up 100 abandoned houses and cleaned up streets. Carl Zerweck, RIPPLING HOPE Executive Director, had received phone calls from District Managers to assist in boarding houses in order to make areas safe for children. Carl mentioned that they received 430 applications this year.

Now, the RIPPLING HOPE TEAM is working on home repairs that are inside of residents' homes. Most of their volunteers are in Detroit from May -August. Therefore, volunteers are needed now to assist with finishing the home repairs even though the RIPPLING HOPE TEAM works year round. Carl needs at least three volunteers to help board up an abandoned house. Mr. Zerweck requested to let him know of any volunteer organization that he can contact to assist with the home repairs. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DETROIT BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS

MOTTO: "ACCOUNTABILITY THROUGH CIVILIAN OVERSIGHT":

CREATION: In 1973, the citizens of Detroit adopted a new form of governance for the Police Department by revising the Detroit City Charter and creating the Board of Police Commissioners. The revised City Charter became effective on July 1, 1974.

<u>CURRENT COMPOSITION</u>: The 2012 City Charter provides for the Board to have 11 commissioners – 4 members appointed by the Mayor, subject to City Council approval, and 7 elected members, one from each non at-large Police Commission District. The 2012 Charter gives the Board "supervisory control and oversight of the Police Department" as set forth in the Charter.

COMMUNITY: Each area of Detroit has their own Commissioner. Commissioners are very active with speaking engagements. We speak at churches, schools and block club meetings. To arrange for a Commissioner to speak to your organization, dial (313) 596-1830.

MEETINGS: The BOPC meets every Thursday at 3:00pm. The second Thursday of every month we meet in the community at 6:30pm. The Board meets at the call of its chairperson, and is required to meet at least once each week but may vote to recess during the Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's holidays. All meetings are held in accordance with the Michigan Open Meetings Act.

DUTIES: The Board is responsible for the following specific duties:

- 1. Establish policies, rules and regulations for the Police Department in consultation with the Chief and approval of the Mayor;
- 2. Review & approve the departmental budget; -Receive and resolve citizen complaints except those alleging criminality;
- 3. Act as final authority in imposing or reviewing discipline of employees of the Department;
- Make an annual report to the Mayor, the City Council, and the public of the Department's activities during the previous year, including the handling of crime and complaints, and of future plans.
- 5. The Board may subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, take testimony, and require the production of evidence:
- 6. The Board approves all promotions made by the Chief, and consents to the appointment of necessary Deputy Chiefs.

STAFF: The Board appoints a Board Secretary. It also appoints a Chief Investigator and such additional staff of investigators, as it deems necessary. Moreover, the Board appoints the Director of Police Personnel who must be a civilian. All Board appointees serve at the Board's pleasure.

BOARD FUNCTION: The Board is a liaison between the citizens of the city of Detroit and the Detroit Police Department.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS: IDENTITY THEFT

While identity theft is a relatively easy crime to commit, investigating and prosecuting criminals is time-consuming and difficult. Citizens must be identity-smart and take steps that reduce the risk of identity theft.

- Examine your credit reports from the major national credit reporting firms at least once a year to make sure no one has established credit in your name or is ruining your credit after stealing your identity.
- → Use a locked mailbox with a slot at home, if at all possible.
- Make sure nobody is standing right behind you when you're using an ATM machine. Always shield your hand and the screen, even if no one is right behind you.
- → Pay your bills online using a secure site if that service is available.
- Don't give out your credit card number on the Internet unless it is encrypted on a secure site.
- Shred all financial statements, billing statements, and preapproved credit card offers.
- Examine all of your bank and credit card statements each month for mistakes or unfamiliar charges that might be the sign of an identity thief at work.
- Commit all passwords to memory. Never write them down or carry them with you.

- Give out your Social Security number only when absolutely necessary.
- Don't carry your Social Security card or auto insurance policies with you.
