

VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE / ENVIRONMENTAL CORNER

CITY OF DETROIT NO INTEREST (0%) ~ HOME REPAIR LOAN INFORMATION

0% home repair loans may be available from \$5,000 to \$25,000 to qualified Detroit homeowners. You would pay back only the amount of the loan. If you meet the requirements listed below, you can apply and are exempt from any household income limits.

- · You must own and occupy your home for at least six months prior to applying
- The minimum credit score is 560
- Homeowner's insurance and taxes must be current
- The homeowner must be able to afford the loan payments.

Eligible projects include correcting health and safety hazards, lead paint, mold, roof replacement, electrical repairs, plumbing repairs, etc. Applications are available on line at www.DetroitHomeLoans.org as well as at Intake Centers and City of Detroit Recreation Centers (Crowell Recreation Center is at 16630 Lahser). Call 211 to be connected to an Intake Center near you.

VACANT HOMES:

Be a watchful neighbor. Remove papers and circulars from the front porch of vacant properties near you or on your block. Work out a schedule with neighbors to mow the lawn if necessary. Your property could be at risk if there is a neglected property nearby. This is a good opportunity to "meet and greet" your neighbors while encouraging action plans for block safety. Call 911 first, then call or email your NPO / Neighborhood Police Officer (Officer Childrey 313-590-5199 / childreys693@detroitmi.gov or Officer Marshall 313-643-0752 / marshalle273@detroitmi.gov) if something seems suspicious. Notify your Block Captain as well as vacant property reps (Diane 313-836-3736 or Ethel at 313-864-3666) as well as our Security Chairperson 313-980-7799.

RE-DISCOVER YOUR BACKYARD:

A good practice is to keep watch over your neighborhood from your front window or front porch. However, with distracted driving and speeding cars another good practice might be to rediscover your backyard. Children should not be playing on front lawns and so close to the street. It's a dangerous world today, and protective steps to keep children safe should be a priority. Backyard BBQ's, swing sets, basketball hoops (not legal in the street), a garden, a quiet and clean area, are just what children need to use their imaginations while playing and being safe under watchful eyes of responsible parents. Clear out your backyard and make time and space for family fun.

IMPROVE DETROIT



How "app" ropriate! If you haven't downloaded the "IMPROVE DETROIT" App and used it to make a complaint – and say THANK YOU afterwards – you won't realize how much we have accomplished in achieving efficient, quick responses from City departments. While we still try to make contact with neighbors who ignore "good neighbor" best practices and City regulations, this is another tool to encourage compliance.

By now, EVERYONE should know the schedule for BULK/YARD WASTE and TRASH COLLECTION in Grandmont which can be found on page 8 and the calendar of this newsletter. Please kindly let new neighbors know that our collection days for BULK and YARD WASTE are on MONDAY — every other week. Bulk items and yard waste will be picked up in brown paper bags ONLY — NO PLASTIC BAGS! BUNDLED branches should be kept separated. PAY ATTENTION TO THIS SCHEDULE! Tickets are expensive and so unnecessary. Your neighbors don't deserve the disrespect of seeing bulk items or trash on the street every week.

PLEASE →PLAY BY THE RULES. You can always call Advanced Disposal 844-233-8764 Monday-Friday and give them your address. They will tell you your collection schedule and answer your questions about these issues. Please remove your container promptly and keep it stored in the rear of your home according to city ordinance Section 22-2-45, etc. It is strongly recommended that you periodically spray your container clean and disinfect it with bleach or vinegar periodically.

FOLLOW-UP MEETINGS FOR GRAND RIVER REDESIGN JUNE 6 AND 7 — **GRDC** is hosting two follow up meetings from the **DESIGN WORKSHOP FOR GRAND RIVER AVENUE**. These will take place Monday, June 6th from 6:00 PM. to 8:00 PM. and Tuesday, June 7th from 9:30 AM to 11:00 AM at the Grandmont Rosedale Development Corporation's Main Office, 19800 Grand River Avenue. Since our Design Workshop with Dover, Kohl & Partners, the City of Detroit's hired consultant team at Bloomberg Associates has been helping **GRDC** to move the five big ideas into a tangible, implementable streetscape project. For those who were unable to attend the April Design Workshop, the five big ideas included focusing efforts to create a 'center', restoring the great street that is Grand River Avenue, adding destinations, preparing for more modes of transit and making a main street as proud as its surrounding neighborhoods.

Guests are encouraged to arrive Monday evening between 6:00 PM and 6:30 PM where they can view diagrams of the street design options in an open house-style format. There will be a presentation at 6:30 PM, followed by a discussion with the consultants from Bloomberg Associates. Tuesday morning, the drawings will be displayed from 9:30 AM to 10:00 AM The presentation will commence at 10:00 AM, followed by discussion.

FENKELL RESURFACING PROJECT DETAILS — An engineering manager from the Wayne County Roads Department spoke at a recent Rosedale Park Improvement Association general membership meeting outlining the upcoming resurfacing project on Fenkell. The project will resurface and reconfigure Fenkell between Southfield and Evergreen, with a projected start date sometime in September and a wrap-up in November. There may be some follow-up work in Spring, 2017.

Plans call for leaving one lane open in each direction during construction. Crews will mill off the asphalt surface, repair joints and cracks in the underlying concrete, then resurface the street with three-and-a-half inches of asphalt

The street will be reconfigured after construction, with one travel lane in each direction, a left-turn lane, and a bike lane in each direction. (This announcement brought a round of applause from the audience!)

Thanks to County Commissioners Bell and Leland for the years of work they have put in to have this stretch of street repaired.

ATTENTION "NOISEMAKERS" → PERMITS ARE REQUIRED AT RAMSAY PARK ~ NO FIREWORKS ARE ALLOWED!

We are a quiet community. We have a neighborhood park. Ramsay Park is maintained by the Grandmont Community and the good neighbors who pick-up trash and litter and refuse to let those who knowingly ignore common sense actions deter our goal of a safe place for children and families to enjoy. We provide our neighbors and friends with an Annual Arts & Crafts Fair and Family Friendly Jazz and fellowship in the summer. Planning and obtaining required permits are managed under the capable leadership of GCA Board Members Jomo King and Ed Smith. That being said, PAY ATTENTION to the rules posted at the Park Entrance:

- ★ No AMPLIFIED MUSIC is permitted.
- ★ NO FIREWORKS are allowed in the park.
- * RAMSAY PARK and its vicinity are in a DRUG FREE ZONE.
- * NO ALCOHOL is permitted in and around the park.
- * NO MOTORIZED VEHICLES are allowed inside the park.
- * There is NO LOITERING after dusk.

OUR QUALITY OF LIFE CALLS FOR ATTENTION TO THESE DETAILS! These rules provide for the safety and enjoyment of our community. If you are having a large gathering at the Park, please be respectful; bring your own garbage bags - and use them to contain food and beverage items. This is another teachable moment for your children to learn about community responsibility and good neighbor practices. We all thank you for paying attention to these regulations.

Neighborhood Parties: No Loud amplified devices are allowed in a neighborhood! Radios and music should be quieted. Today with irregular work schedules and work shifts, adults and children require good sleep. You are being inconsiderate if you ignore your community with regard to loud noise and neighborhood parties. In addition, there are safety concerns. Late night noise is a magnet for late night trouble.

MOTOR CITY MAKEOVER:

We need your help. By now Motor City Makeover (May 21/District 1) has been successful in Grandmont. We can always use leadership to spearhead this event for next year. This year, Grandmont has piggy-backed on the endeavors of GRDC's Becki Kenderes with a Southfield Service Drive clean-up and planting as well as the Community Garden Project behind Bushnell Church and Archdale. We hope you have noticed – and better yet – helped with this project. Roses were planted along the three lots with the beautiful 2-tier white fencing.
