CITY BEGINS RENOVATION FOR NEW 8TH PRECINCT

The Detroit Police Department broke ground this week on a new home for the 8th Precinct, currently colocated with the 6th Precinct. The new home will be in a renovated building at McNichols and Grand River in the rapidly redeveloping Old Redford neighborhood. The new precinct location will be in the former Adult Well-Being Center. New Eighth Precinct is expected to be open and in operation by June 2017.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT)

The (CERT) program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.

ENVIRONMENTAL CORNER

Residents of our beautiful Grandmont Community Association, please keep in mind the following tidbit reminders about solid waste collections at the curb:

- NO styrofoam, plastic bags, batteries or light bulbs in the recycling bin. These can be taken to RECYCLEHERE at 1331 Holden, Mon-Wed (10 AM -6 PM) or Sat (9 AM-3 PM)
- 2. No recycling in your garbage/black bin. Only put garbage there, don't waste the recycling materials.
- YARD WASTE: must be in brown paper yard bags. NO plastic bags for yard waste and NO putting yard waste into the black bin.
- BRUSH (TRIMMINGS UP TO 4 INCHES IN DIAMETER): must be bundled, no longer than 4 feet and no more than 60 lbs. Loose brush will be ticketed.
- Bulk waste is limited to (1 cubic yard) 3 cubic feet. If you cannot parse it out and need a large collection, call the City to get a quote for a special pickup at 313-876-0049.
- Tires will NOT be collected at the curb. A resident can take up to 4 per day to any of the city drop off sites.
- Finally, waste/recycling/yard waste must be at the curb by 7 AM on the day of collection. THAT day only. Leaving ANY waste at the curb puts a resident at risk for a ticket.

Please do not place bulk waste for pickup days before the actual date of pickup. For a variety of reason the items/waste may be scattered, picked over and tossed in the street. Place items out for pickup the day before.

GOOD INFORMATION...DID YOU KNOW?

There is a Senior Citizen Application for a Solid Waste Discount from the \$240.00 yearly fee. Qualifying seniors will receive a discount of \$120.00. Application period is July 1st through September 15th. You must submit a new application every year during the filing period. You must certify that you are the homeowner, at least 65 years of age and gross household income for the preceding calendar year did not exceed \$40,000.00. You must sign an affidavit which must be notarized. I have a few of the forms available for your convenience — (just another "GOOD NEIGHBOR" service provided by the Grandmont Community).

KDB/KEEP DETROIT BEAUTIFUL. Thanks to the efforts of Angela Ireland (KDB), Grandmont was once again able to receive flats of flowers to be planted in the City. NEIGHBORWAY GREENWAY TO LINK COMMUNITY PROJECTS — Save the date of Saturday, August 6th for the grand opening of the NeighborWay, a new five mile walking path throughout the Grandmont Rosedale communities. The path will connect many existing neighborhood points of interest, including parks, gardens, public art and green infrastructure projects. Three hubs will serve to orient visitors to the path. The hubs will be located on Stahelin Avenue near McNichols, on Auburn at the entrance to Stoepel Park and

at the Community Garden at Bushnell Church. Each of these hubs will feature a trailhead with an infestation and maps.

Although exact details for the Grand Opening were not yet determined by the time of this printing, the festivities will occur before the start of the annual Grandmont Art Fair so that residents can enjoy both activities.

The NEIGHBORWAY was developed in collaboration with **PROJECT 561**, a coalition of metro area high school students. The students raised half of the funds needed to implement the project and participated in a number of

service projects to beautify and enhance the NEIGHBORWAY hub locations. In Grandmont, they have volunteered at the Community Garden. Bushnell Church and along the Southfield Service Drive.

"PROJECT 561 derived its name by adding the 313 and 248 area codes together," explained project manager Becki Kenderes. "These students wanted to support a project that united volunteers from the suburbs and the city and chose Grandmont Rosedale as the place to invest their time and energy."


