It is disheartening to see GCA membership at such a low level of participation. We are down approximately 100 dues-paying members from where we were last year. If more residents do not come forward and pay their 2016 membership dues, we may have to forego Street Snow Removal this winter. Snow removal consumed half of all membership dues collected last year. It is not fair to have 25% of the residents pay for everyone. With only 25% of residents paying dues, snow removal would consume 75% of our membership dues this year. Not acceptable! Why should 75% or the residents get a free ride? Everyone benefits from street snow removal, so please pay your dues if you want this service to continue. Dues may be given to your Block Captain or you may mail your check to our PO Box. See the application form on page 3. You may also use PayPal if that is better for you. Without your support and participation we will have to cut services, so please step up if you have not paid your 2016 GCA membership dues. We will also have a dues blitz in October with Block Captains and Board Members going door to door.

Also Board Member Joanne Podlucky is relocating to Adrian. Joanne has been a faithful and hardworking member of the community who co-chaired the flower sale this spring. THANK YOU, JOANNE ~ for your service and dedication. Which brings me to ask if someone in the community would like to fill her position on the board of directors? Her term runs until April of 2017. Please call or email me if you are interested and I can explain the duties of a Board Member.

GRANDMONT BOARD MEMBER NEEDED!

With the new vacancy on the GCA Board of Directors, the announcement and replacement of the vacancy is explained by the Bylaw section below in Article III, Section 2. Please consider applying for the vacant seat; contact Pres. Mark Janusch and help keep our Grandmont community moving forward in a positive manner.

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1: The Board of Directors, hereafter called the Board, shall consist of ten (10) members of the Association. Five (5) are to be elected each year at the Annual Meeting of the Association for a term of two (2) years thereafter or until their successors shall be elected or appointed. One additional member may be appointed annually for a term of one (1) year by the combined elected incoming and outgoing Board in recognition of his/her long standing contributions to the Grandmont Community.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: THE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH PROCEDURES FOR ELECTIONS AND FILL VACANCIES ON THE BOARD, WHETHER OCCASIONED BY DEATH, RESIGNATION, REMOVAL FROM OFFICE OR OTHERWISE WITHIN ONE MONTH FROM THE DATE THE VACANCY OCCURS.

SECTION 3: MEETINGS:

- A. The newly constituted Board shall meet as soon as possible following the Annual Meeting to elect officers, set a meeting schedule and establish committees.
- B. The Board shall meet monthly at a time and place agreed upon by the Board.
- C. Special Board meetings shall be held whenever called by the President or four (4) members of the Board.
- D. The Secretary shall give at least three (3) days' notice to each member of the Board of such meetings.
- E. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum and all matters may be decided by a majority of those present.

SECTION 4: The Board shall have the power to appoint or discharge the Officers and Directors of the Association for such cause as the Board may consider sufficient by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board. Actions that are determined to be improper, immoral, illegal or a violation of civil law shall be considered sufficient to justify the discharge of Officers or Directors.

OCTOBER IS CRIME PREVENTION MONTH ~ CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

October is Crime Prevention month. Read the information below to remind yourself how to stay alert, aware and safe!

BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS! Several recent reports about criminal activity near homes or on properties in Grandmont remind us all how important it is to be aware of our surroundings and look out for each other.

Beware of distractions – follow these tips to help avoid becoming a victim:

- ✓ If you're working in your yard, have someone looking out or have your dog in the yard with you.
- Stick to well-lit, high traffic areas and avoid shortcuts through alleys or isolated areas. Don't walk or jog early in the morning or late at night when the streets are deserted.
- ✓ Trust your instincts. If something appears suspicious or "not right," avoid that area or respond as needed.
- ✓ Don't display cash or any other targets such as cell phones or expensive jewelry. Carry only the money or credit cards you'll need on a particular day.
- If you are shopping, keep an eye out for others who may be sizing you up and stay aware once you leave. Try to park in well-lighted areas with good visibility and close to walkways, stores, and people. Do everything you can to keep a stranger from getting into your car or to keep a stranger from forcing you into his or her car. Don't be afraid to yell for help!
- ✓ Be aware of cars that appear to be driving slowly or return to the same area several times. Try to get detailed descriptions (license plate #, color and type of vehicle, passengers). Help the Police catch these criminals!!
- ✓ Have your house or car key in your hand before you reach the door! NEVER put your house and car keys on the same key ring!
- ✓ Always lock your car, even if it's in your own driveway; **NEVER** leave your motor running.
- ✓ Report crimes immediately to the Police, your leaders in your community and Crime Alert Sites.
- Call your Radio Patrol group and see if they can use your help (contact info on page 2). You don't have to have a car to help, you can ride along as an observer, act as the base (liaison between patrol and the Police Department) or participate by walking or riding your bike.
- ✓ If someone tries to rob you, give up your property—don't give up your life, if you are robbed, assaulted or the victim of any crime, ALWAYS REPORT THE CRIME TO THE POLICE. Try to describe the attacker accurately. Your actions can help prevent someone else from becoming a victim.
- Get to know our Neighborhood Police Officer (NPO) who will assist you with many issues in the neighborhood. Contact information can be found on page 8.

Look out for your neighbors. Call each other and tell them you are looking out for them. Get their phone numbers and get to know your Block Captain. This is a good time to double our usual efforts to keep our neighborhoods safe. Attend the Neighborhood Safety Meeting on the last Thursday, of each month (unless otherwise noted; see calendar on last page) at 6:30 PM at the North Rosedale Community House where the Detroit Police Department's Northwestern District meets with residents about these types of issues.


