WAYNE COUNTY AUCTION – UPDATE: FYI - The September 2016 Wayne County Tax Auction has resulted in three homes being sold within Grandmont for back taxes. Two of those houses were sold for substantially more than the original tax dollars owed. The October 2016 WCT Auction is still ongoing. Currently, there are eight houses and three vacant lot parcels listed for sale in the October 2016 tax auction within the Grandmont neighborhood.

Our Vacant Property Task Force Group is tracking buyer information to observe that city codes and zoning regulations are being complied with and new owners become familiar with our community best practices, high standards, and pride in property preservation. Stay tuned – **GRDC** will once again sponsor a "free of charge" foreclosure workshop to help neighbors remain in their homes. This will be scheduled in early 2017.

Block & Street Captains as well as our many observant neighbors are vital and key people we need and depend on to notify us of negligent property owners and/or vacant homes. Please continue to be watchful and report suspicious activity to the Police (911) our NPO Officer Childrey or Officer Marshall, our Security and Radio Patrol and the Vacant Property Task Force (VPTF). **THANK YOU!**

A reason to be **THANKFUL!** When one door closes, don't slam the other one shut! We can all do better – and do more – as a community. This is the season to be thankful – to count our blessings. RECYCLING: Contact Zero Waste Detroit at 313-986-2990 to see if you can arrange for a free container by attending a local ½ hour workshop to familiarize you with what can - and cannot - be recycled!

Did you know that PLASTIC BAGS CANNOT BE RECYCLED THROUGH THE CITY RECYCLING PROGRAM? Do not put plastic bags, food, liquid waste, Styrofoam, paper milk and juice boxes, light bulbs, batteries, fabrics, paint cans or medical waste in your blue recycling container. These items can damage their equipment. Bring these items to Christ the King on November 19th and safely recycle them.

WAYNE COUNTY BREAST & CERVICAL CANCER CONTROL PROGRAM (BCCCP)

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month but women — and men — need to be vigilant all year!

The Wayne County BCCCP is a community-based partnership created to help provide uninsured, under-insured and lower-income women full access to breast and cervical cancer screening. They are one of the 21 regional programs authorized by the Michigan Department of Community Health to accomplish this goal. Since 1992 the Wayne County BCCCP has provided nearly 100,000 free breast and cervical cancer screenings to local women. In addition to screening services they also provide needed follow up and treatment through our network of over 40 participating clinics and hospitals. For more information or to make an appointment, call (888) 242-2702 or go to their website at http://www.bcccp.org.

The Wayne County BCCCP's mission is to assure that uninsured women in our community have full access to breast and cervical cancer screening, follow up and treatment services by:

- Reaching out to women to increase awareness about the BCCCP
- Partnering with other community organizations to increase community awareness about breast and cervical health and the BCCCP
- Ensuring that program-eligible women can enroll and receive timely, efficient, high quality care
- Establishing a network of health care groups to deliver the program's clinical services at no cost to the woman
- · Providing comprehensive follow up and treatment services for women who need them
- Offering personal support to women to help reduce any barriers to their care
- They offer free breast and cervical cancer screening for eligible women at no out-of-pocket cost. Last year they provided these services for nearly 10,000 women in our community.

SCREENING

You can receive a clinical breast exam, mammogram and Pap smear. And you can receive your care from any of the many local clinics, offices or hospitals that partner with us.

ADDITIONAL TESTS

If you need any additional tests after your screening we'll help you get those taken care of quickly – again, these services are free for eligible women.

TREATMENT

Fortunately, very few women find that they need any type of treatment after their screening. But if you do have a potentially serious problem they'll be there to help you. While only a small number of women will need such treatment it's reassuring to know that the Wayne BCCCP will help arrange and pay for it.






