HAPPY NEW YEAR to all Grandmont Residents! 2017 marks the 90th year since the "Grandmont Improvement Association" was formed. Yes, that was our original name back

in 1927. I, along with the Board of Directors, are the current custodians of this fine and long-lived organization. One day we will pass the mantle to the next elected board and they will take on the new challenges that change with the times. The early organization was concerned with building lines, grades, front yards, garages and the size and character of the homes being built in the neighborhood.



Today, we are concerned with snow plowing and how to pay for that costly service. Filled with compassion and a sense of responsibility to care for women and girls who were homeless, or caught in abusive, destructive and dangerous situations, the Sisters devoted their lives to helping women and girls regain their self-worth, dignity and become self-sufficient—in much the same way as **VISTA MARIA** does today

Over the years, the agency continued to grow to meet the ever-changing needs of children and their families from our communities Today, the agency offers an array of community-based programs that include: education through two oncampus charter schools; general and treatment foster care; youth assistance programming; independent living; transition services; and after-school programming.

With a strong foundation and core values firmly in place, the Sisters' mission of caring for the whole person — physically, emotionally and spiritually — will continue to guide the agency's efforts to help our vulnerable children and families end the multi-generational cycle of poverty and achieve self-sufficiency

FOSTER CARE & ADOPTION:

Each year, there are over 12,000 foster children in Michigan, with nearly half of those children residing in metro Detroit area. Children in foster care are no different than our own children. They need caring adults who will love, nurture, protect and inspire them to fulfill their dreams. Each foster child needs a family that is ready to commit to their success so that each child can grow and become self-sufficient.

- Children are placed in foster care when their family is in crisis and their safety becomes a concern.
- Children are placed in a licensed home, and during this time services are provided to both children and family.
- ➤ Vista Maria needs licensed home to take care of boys and girls ages 0 17.

We have the best Radio Patrol, a dedicated GCA Board, partnership with the Grandmont-Rosedale Development Corporation, scholarship program, this newsletter, *THE GRANDMONITOR*, Art Fair and perhaps most importantly this winter is our street-snow removal service. We've been able to do all of this because of **YOUR \$25.00** yearly dues payment. THANK YOU to everyone who purchased a holiday wreath or made a donation to the Vacant Property Task Force Fundraiser in November/December. Our volunteers use 100% of these proceeds to help beautify and secure vacant properties within the five communities of GRDC. We also send letters to property owners, investors, attend Hearings/Court when necessary and work with Buildings & Safety and our DPD NPO's as well as our Department of Neighborhoods Coordinators Stephanie Young and Reggie "Reg" Davis. We interact with DPW, the Detroit Land Bank, City Council (THANK YOU COUNCILMAN TATE, EDWINA KING, REGINALD ALEXANDER AND AARON HALL!). We

meet the 3rd Tuesday of the month at Always Brewing Coffee Shop at 10 AM. In Grandmont, we work with the Grandmont Radio Patrol to monitor vacant houses. We are trying to focus more on the Southfield Service Drive by planting trees on vacant lots to help buffer noise and pollution and provide for better water retention and overall beautification. We have applied for a "Detroit Future City" Grant to improve a lot close to Schoolcraft and working towards demolishing another vacant house in the same block. STAY TUNED!

FORECLOSURE PREVENTION: TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THIS PROGRAM IF YOU ARE IN DANGER OF LOSING YOUR HOME TO BACK TAXES!

We are again offering a FREE information service and workshop to help homeowners stay in their homes. The United Community Housing Coalition is hosting a workshop on Thursday, February 16th at 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM at the North Rosedale Park Community House located at 18445 Scarsdale Street — west of the Southfield Fwy. This FREE service provides confidential help and information about programs you may not be aware of and can answer many of your questions to help prevent foreclosure.

In January 2017, the City is rolling out a better defined rental property program focused on compliance and registration guidelines and inspections to benefit property preservation and home values. The boundaries include Greenfield to Evergreen and Grand River. We will be working with the Buildings & Safety Departments to assist with this program.

Our neighborhood relies on the good will and extra effort of each of us to make a good "first impression" of our community. Below are a few suggestions to help get the New Year off to a good start and create better first impressions while boosting our Grandmont Community expectations:

- Please make sure your window treatments are in good condition and hung properly.
- Remove litter promptly. Sweep, shovel or rake the area in front of your home. Don't forget to clear street storm drains in front of your home in the spring.
- Dogs need to be on a leash when walked; carry and use a pooper scooper when necessary.
- Please try to keep your car(s) parked off the street and park in your driveway or garage. Do not park your vehicles on the lawn it is illegal to park on non-cemented surfaces in our neighborhood.
- LIGHT THE NIGHT. Make sure your home can be seen by neighbors at night. You can't say something if you can't see something!

When you look out of your window, your view should be pleasing and beautiful. After all, we have beautiful homes in our community so make it a priority in 2017 to better our surroundings so we can all enjoy a view to better days ahead in the Grandmont Community.

DID YOU KNOW? You need to sign up for the GIN (GRANDMONT INFORMATION NETWORK) as well as the neighborhood GRANDMONT COMMUNITY CRIME ALERT SYSTEM. Please make sure you send your email information to Mary Muhammad at marrym4gca@gmail.com to be included in this valuable service. Sometimes THE GRANDMONITOR doesn't get to you in time to take advantage of programs offered. The GIN regularly notifies residents of upcoming community events. THE CRIME ALERT is a separate service that can be helpful when bad things happen by alerting the community of what's going on!



TAX FORECLOSURE PREVENTION WORKSHOP – SAVE YOUR HOME — See what resources are available at any stage of tax foreclosure by receiving FREE, ON-SITE ASSISTANCE to help you save your home! Grandmont Rosedale Development Corporation has teamed-up with the United Community Housing Coalition to assist residents facing foreclosure. THE WORKSHOP IS FREE and open to the public. Homeowners or tenants in any stage of foreclosure are strongly encouraged to attend, this free, on-site assistance workshop on Thursday, February 16, 2017 from 5:00 PM - 8:00 PM at the N. Rosedale Park Community House, 18445 Scarsdale, Detroit 48223 (north of Grand River between Glastonbury & Avon). If you are facing foreclosure and attending the workshop, please bring the following documents with you (if available):



- · Copy of your deed
- · Driver's license or state identification card
- Recent DTE bill, phone bill or other letter with your name and address on it
- · Any and all correspondence from Wayne County

If you're unable to attend this workshop, other sites around the city are also offering informational sessions and help for property owners. 

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
