MONTESSORI PROGRAM AT EDISON ELEMENTARY

New Montessori Program a huge draw for families to Edison Elementary

Edison Elementary was one of just three Detroit Public Schools this fall to launch a tuition-free public Montessori program, and the program has been a draw to families.

Edison has attracted 69 students to the program, which was part of an Innovation Proposal in Detroit Public Schools Community District to bring public Montessori programs to seven classrooms in three schools for Fall 2016. The other programs are located at Spain Elementary-Middle School in Midtown and Maybury Elementary in Southwest Detroit.

"We are so pleased to offer the Montessori curriculum to our families," said Edison Principal Marcus Davenport. "Edison is located in the heart of some of the strongest communities in the city of Detroit and we know our parents have many schools from which they can choose. Being able to offer this proven, well-researched program shows that we are serious about being innovative and offering families desirable programming that will boost academic success."

The Montessori program builds upon a variety of specialized offerings at Edison, including technology-rich classrooms, a partnership with Art Road to bring inspiration art projects to classes, university partnerships, including ones with Michigan State Student Teachers and University of Michigan Pre-Student Teachers program, a Student Broadcast Team and Geek Squad Technology Club.

The Montessori program allows for a student-centered, hands-on learning approach in a multi-age learning environment. At Detroit, Public Montessori, our purpose is to foster a love of learning and help all our children reach their fullest potential at their own unique pace. We strive to educate the whole child and to inspire children to be caring, socially responsible participants both in our community and in the larger world, said Nicola Turner, Director of Montessori for DPSCD.

Students in the Montessori classrooms engage in lessons where they acquire clear, conscious, information and learn to make independent decisions in a prepared environment. Parents will also participate in Family Community meetings that help them understand the Montessori philosophy.

Teachers, who spent the summer engaged in intense training to prepare their new learning environments, have been excited to welcome their new students into their classrooms and bring the highly-regarding teaching model and curriculum to DPSCD, Turner said.

"These dedicated and wonderful teachers continue their training monthly by giving up one Saturday a month to continue to invest in the Montessori learning process," Turner said.

The program at Edison includes four classrooms for grades Pre-K to 2 for 4 to 7-year-olds. The district hopes to extend the program through fifth grade in the coming school years.

VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE / ENVIRONMENTAL CORNER

APRIL..."No matter how long the winter, spring is sure to follow", says a proverb. This winter we were blessed with warm, almost summerlike temperatures in mid-February. Certainly reason enough for some to overlook "neighborly good practices" with music playing a little too loud, kids playing in the street, and other signs of early spring fever taking over a bit of common sense. We all appreciated the relief from winter blahs and winter blues and will eagerly anticipate the coming seasons, hopefully with the expected consideration of peace and quiet and common courtesies toward our neighbors in our community.

FORECLOSURE HELP – Perhaps a good sign was the fewer amount of people than in past years who attended the Foreclosure Prevention Workshop on February 16th. Ted Phillips and the capable staff at UCHC (UNITED COMMUNITY HOUSING COALITION) did a wonderful job in explaining various programs available in a confidential setting that might help each person facing foreclosure. All this expertise was available right in our own community and we thank them for their assistance. Please feel free to visit their office at 2727 Second Avenue, Suite 313. Phone: (313) 963-3310. PLEASE NOTE: If you are in a payment plan, you may be able to reduce your interest rate: Interest Reduction Stipulated Payment Agreement (IRSPA)* reduces interest from 18% to 6% for all taxes owed, requires a small deposit and monthly payments over five years. This plan will be available: AFTER April 9, 2017 until June 17, 2017. *By law this plan is discretionary with the Wayne County Treasurer.

Members advocate for the demolition of dangerous properties, assist with code enforcement, host dozens of cleanups at vacant properties, mow hundreds of overgrown lawns per year and host tax foreclosure prevention workshops. NOTES FROM THE GRAND RIVER PLANNING MEETING

Over 75 northwest Detroit residents packed Bushnell Church last Wednesday for the second of four planned meetings for citizen input into plans for upgrades to Grand River and other area corridors.

Participants worked in group, discussing a variety of ideas for redesigning the Grand River roadway, repurposing the now-closed Rogell Golf Course site, and highlighting historic and cultural sites in the area. Audience response technology collected data for a range of ideas to tally reactions. Finally, two locations were identified as first targets: Grand River/Fenkell/Southfield, and Grand River/Lahser.

The next meeting is set for April 18, and is a planned open-house format, which will allow drop-in visits and discussion. The time and place will be announced.

For those who have not had a chance to take part in one of the meetings, the City Planning Department and design staff have set up an online survey to gather more input. You can find a link to the survey at www.detroitmi.gov/northwest.

Here's what's accepted and what's not:

NEW ROSEDALE EXPRESS BUS SERVICE TO DOWNTOWN DETROIT: A new express bus route that serves our neighborhood began at the end of January. The DDOT 92 ROSEDALE EXPRESS offers five eastbound (to Downtown) buses in the AM and six westbound (from Downtown) in the PM.

The eastbound route starts around 8 Mile and Evergreen. The bus travels down Evergreen to Grand River and gets on the Jeffries Fwy (I-96) at Schaefer cutting transit time in half. It ends downtown around Jefferson and St. Antoine. This route serves both Henry Ford and Cass Tech High



Schools, Edison Elementary and all business areas from Evergreen to Schaefer on Grand River.

You can board the **92 ROSEDALE EXPRESS** at any **DDOT** bus stop along the route by signaling the bus from any of the stops. Stops that serve both the **21 GRAND RIVER** and **92 ROSEDALE EXPRESS** have both route numbers on the **DDOT** signage, and many now have a 92 route map posted. For more route, times and bus fare information, go to **detroitmi.gov** and click on the **bus schedules** link on the right side of the page. (**NOTE: STUDENTS, SENIORS OVER 65 AND THE DISABLED WITH PROPER ID GET A SIGNIFICANT DISCOUNT ON BUS FARE**.
