JUNE, 2017 PRESIDENT'S REPORT ~ MARK JANUSCH

It has been a few months since I last updated the residents of Grandmont. In April, we had our Annual Dinner Meeting at Christ the King Church. It was well attended; we elected two new board members and reelected three incumbents. The new members are Yvonne Sanders and Ottumn Kennedy. At the May board meeting we reelected the same officers who served in 2016. Jomo King was elected to the 11th member position on the board replacing Cora Duncan-Foster who held that position for the past year (*Five (5) members are elected each year at the Annual Meeting of the Association for a term of two (2) years thereafter or until their successors shall be elected or appointed. One additional member may be appointed annually for a term of one (1) year by the combined elected incoming and outgoing Board in recognition of his/her long standing contributions to the Grandmont Community).*

We've had our share of property crime involving unoccupied homes. I got involved with one incident recently and helped with boarding up the house and getting the utilities turned back on. Techniques that the perpetrators are using are to toss a large rock or chunk of concrete through a window and wait to see if there is a response. They pull the electric meter and cut the phone line. They then enter and disable the alarm system if it has been set off with a motion detector. Detroit Police responded very quickly; the only items taken were a flat screen television and the hot water tank. So for a flat screen that would pawn for \$25 and \$7 scrap value on the water tank they did hundreds of dollars' worth of damage! Please look out for one another. If you see something suspicious call 911 and report the crime. We must all work together to drive crime out of our neighborhood!

On Monday May 15th, I had the privilege to attend an update with Mayor Duggan to hear about his plans for the neighborhoods. The meeting was well attended. These are the key points he discussed:

MAYOR DUGGAN'S 4 YEAR NEIGHBORHOOD PLAN

- Organize "Board Up Brigades" for vacant houses. Approximately 100-200 per week will be boarded up
- Crack down on illegal dumping, install cameras and seize vehicles of violators
- > Stringent code enforcement of rental homes. Over the next three years all of the 50,000 rental properties must be inspected and brought up to code. If a property does not have a certificate of occupancy, the tenant can stop paying rent. Presently only 5,000 properties are registered as rentals. Additional inspectors will be hired. Certificates of occupancy must be renewed each year.
- Remove 10,000 dead trees
- Replace 250,000 broken slabs of concrete sidewalks
- Expand neighborhood police officers from 44 to 59
- Clean out street catch basins
- Strategic neighborhood funding to invest in West Village, Bagley/Fitzgerald, and SW Detroit
- Increase the number of commercial building demolitions..

CONVENIENTLY PAY YOUR DETROIT WATER BILL; 28 KIOSK LOCATIONS IN AND AROUND THE CITY

The **Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD)** serves more than 230,000 accounts that include a residential population of nearly 700,000. **DWSD**'s water network consists of more than 2,700 miles of water main and nearly 3,000 miles of sewer collection piping within the city of Detroit. To learn more about **DWSD** or to request water services, make payments, or report water problems, call **DWSD** Customer Care at **313-267-8000** or contact us at **www.detroitmi.gov/dwsd**.

Now you can skip the line by paying your Detroit water and sewer bill at 28 kiosk locations in and around the city. The Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD) has joined DTE Energy and the Wayne County Treasurer's Office on the DIVDAT KIOSK NETWORK.

DETROIT WATER AND SEWER CUSTOMERS MAY VISIT A KIOSK TO:

- Pay with cash, personal check or credit card with no extra fee;
- Review account information using service address or account number, or scan their bill;
- Have the payment applied to their account the same day; and
- Conveniently pay near home or work.
 The kiosks offer language options for English, Spanish and Arabic.

CITY BANS CAMPFIRES, GRILLS AND SMOKERS IN FRONT YARDS OR UNDER PORCH ROOF

A new City of Detroit ordinance bans open burning or outdoor cooking within 10 feet of a flammable structure or property line, or under a roof or enclosure. The ordinance also requires that ALL BURNING OR OUTDOOR COOKING TAKE PLACE IN THE SIDE YARD OR REAR YARD ONLY. It bans fire pits or campfires, barbeques, smokers, or outdoor ovens in front yards, on front porches or on sidewalks. Residents will be liable for all costs of "FIRE SUPPRESSION" and violations could bring a \$500 fine. To get details on the kinds of outdoor burning that are still permitted or to find out how this new ordinance could affect you, contact the Fire Marshall's office.


