BRIAN VINCENT RHODES




rian Rhodes grew up in our Grandmont community with his parents and sister over 30 years ago. He liked art and animation as a youth but being a brilliant young man and not really seeing a secure future in his passion, he decided to pursue another avenue. After graduating from high school, he entered and graduated from the University of Michigan where he earned degrees in mechanical engineering and industrial design. Brian went to work designing for several companies such as NASA, CHRYSLER and APPLE, to name a few, but he retained and continued to pursue his love of art, animation and filmmaking. While working at APPLE, he won a film competition which turned his focus to his first love – cinema.

Rhodes decided he was ready to make his dream of film a reality and applied to the famous University of Southern California's film school in Los Angeles. There he focused on writing and directing animation. Brian has since won two TELLY AWARDS for his student work and his

thesis, "Mosquito: THE BITE OF PASSAGE", has been called "the most technically advanced film in the history of USC" by faculty.

Rhodes now works as a storyboard artist at BLUE SKY STUDIOS, a feature film division of 20th CENTURY FOX, known for the "Ice Age" and "Peanuts" franchises. He is also working on developing a television show he created at FX, also a division of 20th CENTURY FOX. Brian has worked as a storyboard artist, designer and animator on films that have been shown on Netfux, at the Sundance FILM FESTIVAL and the GRAMMYS. He is also an improv actor and a 2016 Diversity Fellow of the Upright Citizen's BRIGADE comedy theatre.





I was so surprised and delighted to see that our Grandmont son was home to compete in this exciting competition. Family, friends and Grandmont neighbors piled into the Charles H. Wright Museum to cheer him on during "THE 2017 DETROIT VOICES COMPETITION" which ran for nine weeks. Eighteen short film finalists were chosen from more than a hundred entries - all of them amazing. Brian's film, "Mosquito: The Bite of Passage", won "Honorable Mention"!

GARDEN CLUB ~ THE GARDEN CLUB NEEDS NEW MEMBERS

PEACE TO ALL! When I joined the Garden Club in 2002, fifteen years ago, we only had five members. Most of the original members have now passed or moved away. New members have come but over the years but we have all gotten older and cannot keep up with all of the Garden Club projects we've done in the past. Over the years, the Grandmont Garden Club has really made a difference in the community. Every year we plant flowers at the Marva Greenwood Smails Memorial Garden at Chaney Library in the memory of one of our Garden Club members, and plant flowers on every block at the entrance of our neighborhood on Grand River and Schoolcraft. Over the years these pots have been a challenge to maintain since some have been stolen, broken etc. and needed to be replaced.



We plant flowers every June, but once flowers are planted they need to be watered. We need help watering flowers so they will not die during the hot months. At this point we are again down to four active members. We need community support to keep our Grandmont community looking beautiful. It would be very helpful if you would put a container of water in your car and water a pot at the corner of your block; if they are not watered on a regular basis, they will die. If you can plant and maintain flowers in the pots that would also be helpful. The larger flower bed needs cleaning out on Woodmont and Grand River. We are doing our best to make Grandmont beautiful but we need neighbors that live here with us to take some time out of their busy

schedules to help. We want to place the Marva Greenwood Smails Award signs again and resume the garden tours which most summers allowed us to give \$500.00 for the GCA Scholarship Fund. Please help us keep the Garden Club going; we can't do it with only four active members. You moved here because you wanted to live in a beautiful neighborhood. Let's work together to improve on what the Garden Club has been doing and make it better. The Grandmont Garden Club meets every 2nd Tuesday of the month from March through September at the Chaney branch library 6 PM to 7:30 PM.

FORECLOSURE UPDATE: The good news is that many homeowners have entered into agreements with the City and/or County to pay overdue taxes and will not lose their homes to tax foreclosure. THE BAD NEWS IS THAT AS OF JUNE 10, 2017 THERE ARE EIGHT FORECLOSED HOMES IN GRANDMONT. While the number of foreclosures is dwindling, there are still good people losing their homes. In some cases they just don't know or haven't taken advantage of free advice from sources like UNITED HOUSING COALITION who are very knowledgeable about various programs and steps to take to avoid foreclosure. It might be worth a trip to the UCHC office at 220 Bagley Suite, 224, 313-963-3310. GRDC has sponsored outreach right in our own communities to help keep neighbors informed of steps to help avoid losing their homes. THANK THEM!

Spay and neuter services offered at no cost (FREE!) for Detroit canines. PROJECT GRACE is just one of a dozen programs planned by non-profits to reduce the over-population of dogs in the City. In its first year in 2016, the program served 108 dogs. (Savings average \$140!) PROJECT GRACE offers free spaying and neutering for Detroit residents' dogs at DETROIT ANIMAL CARE & CONTROL CENTER. THE NEXT DAY FOR SPAYING AND NEUTERING IS THURSDAY, JULY 13. Advance registration is required. IS ANYONE LISTENING? Do you have a neighborhood issue that needs resolution? If you haven't attended the District 1 Community Satellite Meetings that our D1 Councilman James Tate holds on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month, come to the next scheduled meetings on July 5th and July 19th (11:00 AM – 1:00 PM) This might be your chance to help solve your City problem. Councilman Tate generously provides time, resources, staff and free coffee at these informal meetings which are held at the MOTOR CITY JAVA & TEA HOUSE, 17336 Lahser (near the Redford Theater just North of Grand River).

THIS IS WHAT TO EXPECT: Nice people, generally 15-25 people representing their various neighborhoods from all over District 1 attend. Information is shared, questions asked, updates on City regulations or policies is provided and help is sometimes available at just a click or a keystroke. Toward the end of the meeting, everyone has a turn if they wish to speak about an issue of importance to them. Not every problem can be solved immediately, but resources are available to connect quickly to City Departments and you will receive information and feedback from Councilman Tate or his efficient staff to help resolve your concern. You will also learn about good things happening in D1. Improvements on Grand River for instance are in the works now with Neighborhood Planning Meetings in full swing in Grand River Northwest! So share your thoughts or just listen, gain new perspectives, meet like-minded concerned City residents and plan on attending one of these meetings. There will be no August meetings. The regularly scheduled meetings will resume in September.

Mr. Penney presented information about how the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office successfully prosecutes cases and talked about his role in the prosecution process.

DID YOU KNOW?

Senior Citizen Applications are available for a Solid Waste Discount from the \$240.00 yearly fee which is automatically accessed to our City tax bill. Qualifying seniors will receive a discount of \$120.00.

APPLICATION PERIOD IS JULY 1st TO SEPTEMBER 15th.

You must submit a NEW application every year during the filing period.

You must certify that you are the homeowner, at least 65 years of age & your gross household income for the previous calendar year did not exceed \$40,000.00.

You also need to sign an affidavit which must be notarized.
