

#### Get Ready for our Annual Meeting in April!





This is not the same thing as being on the "Senior Plan" - which just has benefits like no service cut-offs, pick your own due date, etc. You'll need to call main no., answer "Other Options" before a representative comes on to assist you. This discount program has been in effect since 2015. Take advantage of it to save you some cash.


